**A SPARK OF HEAVEN IN EAST OAKLAND**

Cely is 62 years old. She survived a breast cancer 10 years ago. 3 years ago, her cancer of the throat did not kill her. This time, she is on the last stage of her cancer of the tongue. She cannot eat nor drink. Not even a straw could touch her tongue. Doctors could not even identify whether it is 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> stage. They say, it is the last last stage. She gladly named it stage 7, the perfect number. Could her naming it 7 a perfect way to proclaim the Gospel of today when Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy seven times. That is the Kingdom of heaven..." (Mt. 18:22-23) I had the privilege to anoint her last month. She was so vibrant and at peace. With a difficulty in listening to her caused by the deformity of her tongue, she said, "I thank God for everything... and everyday. I am at peace, father." And you see a genuine joy in spite of her suffering. Not even her cancer of the tongue can silence her to speak of the goodness of God. With her disposition, I preached to myself, "You see Aris, she all has the right to complaint before God yet she chose praising God. What is your right to complaint about petty problems? Can't you just talk about God?"

The readings of today, the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Times, encourage us to focus on God so we can experience peace. The first reading opens with clear a statement, "Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight." Oopppsss, how crazy are we sometimes that we nurse anger and bitterness within us, "we hug them tight" without us realizing we self-destruct. I read it from a poem of a child, "Our worry, make us hurry, to the cemetery!" I propose instead, "Don't worry, be happy, stay healthy!" Let go of all negativities and self-centeredness so God can take charge. PEACE.

St. Paul understands peace as everything for and with the Lord. Our life is for the Lord and even our death is also for him. (Rom 14:8) This is what peace is all about. If we offer everything to the Lord, you think He will be insensitive to us? And so the Gospel talks about how we become channels of forgiveness, of grace, of blessings and of peace. These four words (forgiveness, grace, blessing and peace) talk about one reality. Just as we are forgiven many times by the Lord, so we shall forgive many times. Just as we have received much blessings from Him, so shall we become blessings to others. Don't be the dead-end of blessings. Don't be selfish. Be selfless and be countless.

Back to St. Benedict. In my regular walk around the church grounds one afternoon, a car suddenly parked. The driver, a woman in her perhaps mid 60's called my attention. She appeared so distressed that she had been going around for hours but she could not find her home. My heart bled literally for it can happen that we want to go home and yet we could not just find our way. This woman knew she was lost and the only place she remembered was that her home was near the Church. Wow, she must have loved the Church so much that losing sense of home, she had the church as a compass. With the help of *waze*, (a cellphone application) I drove my car, she followed and I brought her home. Once we found the home address, I deliberately left in haste. I wanted to sneak out from the scene and talked to God instead. "Lord, I am a sinner. Oftentimes, I complaint about petty things. But this time I hope I did something good. I am not complaining. I just want this small good deed to be just between the two of us. If there is a reward for it, I want you to deliver it personally when I get there." Then I went home in peace knowing I have in store something "there".

Last Sunday (September 3), while I was with Fr. Jayson in the Rectory, Dionne, yes, the woman who welcomed me and brought a basket full of fruits (the story I wrote last Sunday, September 10) came saying to me, "Father, I want to thank you for bringing home my sister the other day." What?!?! Caught unprepared, I wanted to ask, "How did you know it? I told God to just keep it between the two of us." But I chose to remain silent, listened to her and perhaps figure out what is God telling me. After listening to her, Fr. Jayson's face glowed in awe and smiled saying, "Aris, I am happy for you!" Honestly, I did not know how to handle the "thank you" of Dionne and the compliment of Fr. Jayson. All I knew at that time was, in the company of the two, a brother and a sister; I experienced a deep sense of peace and fulfillment. I swear it was not me at all. I can only imagine God filling up all empty spaces that time. And believe me, at that moment all I felt was that a spark of heaven ruptured a small space on earth we call St. Benedict Church. And this kingdom of heaven is in East Oakland, California.

Welcome to the home of God, where no sinner is denied of repentance, no cancer of the tongue can stop us proclaiming God, no lost driver is deprived of home, no lonely person remains in isolation. Everybody is welcome here. Welcoming people frustrate sin in everything. At the door of St. Benedict's Church, Benedict's medal hangs where no evil can enter. Only the kindness and mercy of God is multiplied not seven times but seventy seven times. Amen.
