FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



The Bible often pictures God as a groom who jealously loves and cares for his bride (his chosen people), and time after time it compares God's love for us to the love between a husband and wife. This intense love relationship is what makes the Christian God different from the gods of most other religions. Some religions teach about a God who, because he is other-worldly and distant, is not concerned about our everyday lives; other religions teach about a powerful God or vengeful and punishing God. Along with Judaism and Islam, Christianity is one of the few religions that teaches about a God of love who is not only interested in us but who also wants to share his life with us.

Two people who love each other try to make each other happy. A husband shows love for his wife by doing the things that please her and by avoiding the things that make her angry. The wife, likewise, shows her love for her husband in the same fashion. But they first have to communicate what it is that pleases them. They need to make their likes and dislikes known to each other, telling each other how to love. This same process takes place in our relationship with God.

In today's reading, Jesus tells us we can show our love for him by keeping his commandments. This means we shouldn't think of the commandments just as a list of do's and don'ts but instead compare them to the husband who buys his wife flowers on her birthday or the wife with surprises for husband by taking him out to his favorite restaurant. Just as these are ways a married couple say "I love you" to each other, following the commandments are ways we can say "I love you" to God.

As in other relationships, our relationship with God is a two-way street. We not only show our love for God but God also shows love for us. Jesus showed the depth of his love by dying on the cross for us, a love so great he was even willing to suffer pain and endure humiliation on our behalf. As Jesus says in today's Gospel, the greatest love possible is for a person to give their life for their friends. We are Jesus friends if we do what he commands us.

Friends like to spend time together. Take a few minutes today to go someplace by yourself so you can spend some quiet time with your friend Jesus. Sit in a comfortable chair and relax. Forget about whatever is bothering you and simply be aware of Jesus presence .

Do this for a few minutes each day and see the difference it makes.

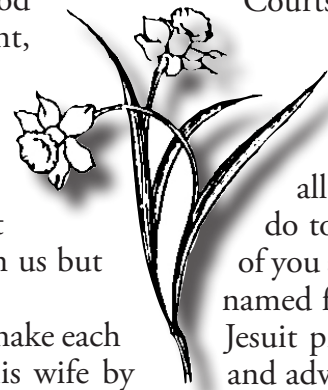
Congratulations to our Knights of Peter Claver Ladies Auxiliary Court 336 for being awarded the KPC Western States Court of the Year at last week's Western States District Convention in Portland, Oregon. There are approximately 30 KPC Auxiliary Courts in the Western District, spanning Arizona, California, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon and Washington. This is a very distinct and great honor to be acknowledged as the Court of the Year. Continued gratitude for all of the work that our KPC women and men do to enhance life here at St. Benedict! As many of you already know, the Knights of Peter Claver are named for St. Peter Claver, a 17th Century Spanish Jesuit priest who ministered to slaves in Columbia and advocated for the abolition of slavery.

And speaking of slavery, I am still aghast at the comments made by Kanye West (on TMZ) about the "choice" slaves had regarding their situation. If you missed that interview earlier in the week, Mr. West said, "When you hear about slavery for 400 years - for 400 years? That sounds like a choice. Like, you was there for 400 years and it's all of y'all? It's like we're mentally in prison."

Some of us clergy from Oakland Community Organizations have been involved with pressuring the City of Oakland, more specifically city leadership, with putting an end to trash and garbage in our flatland streets and illegal dumping in our neighborhoods. This past week, the City of Oakland announced that they were hiring more inspectors and an enforcement component to trash mitigation. This is good news for all of us who live in flatland Oakland.

If you haven't had a chance to visit the Hip Hop exhibit at Oakland Museum of California, please make it a point to do so. It's a great opportunity to become more informed about hip-hop's roots in the musical, cultural and sociological milieu of the African American experience. It's also a chance to see the local connection to the evolution of this vital musical genre.
