## FROM THE DESK OF MARY BETH JESUS' LIFE-GIVING DEATH

"Few stories are more familiar to us as Christians than the Gospel accounts of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. All four Gospels tell essentially the same tale. After an inspiring and tumultuous public ministry, Jesus and his disciples went to Jerusalem at the time of the Passover feast. After celebrating a special last meal with his closest followers, Jesus was arrested in an olive grove just outside the city walls, His fearful disciples deserted him. After interrogating Jesus, the religious and civil authorities collaborated to do away with him. He was flogged, then executed by crucifixion, and buried. Some days later (on the third day, by ancient reckoning) his followers see him again – alive. From these events the Christian faith was born."

How well do you understand all this that has happened? How much is it a part of your life? Would you like to walk with the disciples on this road and come to know what they experienced with them?

If you answered "yes" to any of those questions, then I invite you to join with others during this coming Lenten Season and read anew the Passion Narrative as it is offered in the Gospel of Matthew 26-28. Walk with the disciples. Encounter Jesus speaking directly to you, "Remain here and stay awake with me." Ponder how you might have responded if you had been one of Jesus' disciples.

You have many options of small groups you might join to study these passages in Scripture. You may decide to study the book alone, or carry on discussion on-line in a Blog discussion board set up for this purpose. Don't miss this opportunity to enrich your Lenten Journey in a profound way.

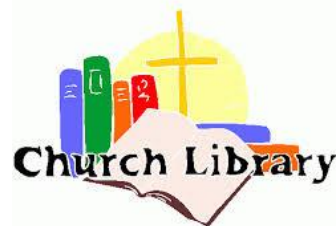

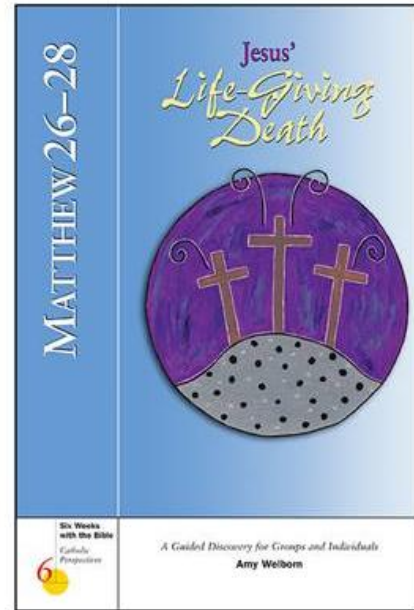
