FROM THE DESK OF FR. MICHAEL A FINAL FAREWELL

Last week I wrote about some of the issues that we had to deal with over the last two years. I would like to continue this week. There are a number of issues that the parish, Catholic Church as a whole, and we as a nation must face. This is partial opine, but it is factual.

1. **Church Participation.** There is no doubt that the participation at Mass continues to decline here, and at other parishes. This decline is attributed to a number of factors, but most importantly in my opinion is the relevance of faith in people's lives, especially those under age 45. Parents don't support a foundation of teaching their children that Mass attendance is a priority. Making a commitment to God is not as important as other activities such as sports, trips, shopping, and taking Sunday mornings off. To be a faithful servant, one needs to engage God and accept His welcome. It takes commitment, obedience to God's law, and a willing heart. Commitment and obedience are not good words in the modern day. We often wish to do something else that involves something else. It amazes me for a number of years that parents will bring children to Religious Education, but don't take them to Church. Yes, CCD and Catholic education are vital, but it must continue at Mass as we celebrate the Lord's prayer, and prayers for others as a community, but most importantly receive our Lord at Communion. Missing Mass is a mortal sin, and should never be replaced by personal desire or other pleasures. We are given 168 hours in a week, we should give one hour to God willingly.

2. **Sports on Sunday Mornings.** Let's face reality, over 99% of our kids will not play pro sports as a career. Most young people will not get a full, or significant scholarship for college because of sports. So, why are we placing sports above God, who can give us peace, and heaven, if we willingly follow Him? It's time to make God a priority again

3. **Culture and Society.** It is amazing that we have seen the destruction of norms, and mores, and moral responsibility to God. Our culture and society promoted by the media is very much supporting an agenda that is counter to our beliefs, and faith. We are considered to be intolerable if we speak up for our faith and beliefs. Ironically, the same people who preach tolerance are often the most intolerant. No, it's not acceptable to change ourselves because we want to be something that we want, instead of what God has created. No, it's not acceptable to support organizations who say that they are for women's health, like planned parenthood, but are the largest provider of abortion. Remember, God created us, and it's not our right to change, alter, or destroy what God has made.

4. **Willingness to Accept the Cross.** I have spoken and written often that we need to embrace our challenges, and crosses. Indeed some of these challenges are long, and difficult, but find yourself united to our Lord's passion. Embrace God, ask and seek courage, and fortitude.

5. **Accept a White Martyrdom.** Unlike a red martyrdom, which means we are killed for our faith, a white martyrdom means we accept disdain, or verbal assault for believing in the Catholic Church, and living it in our daily lives. As the growth of apathy continues, there will be some who reject us, but stand firm, be peaceful in following God's will.

6. **Government.** Locally, we have mixed results. As you know, I spent a number of years working in government prior to entering the seminary. During that time, I was fortunate to meet many elected officials. Many communities and officials were very open to the role of

Church and parishes in the community. Unfortunately, I have not witnessed that here in West Milford. It has been a continuous struggle with the elected leaders. I cannot understand even till this day that the leadership at the top is opposed to faith in this community. It is remarkable that we have to get a permit to display the Christmas crèche and our Knights, despite the weather, are outside for 10 hours on the municipal green on Christmas eve to man the display, even though legally it can be displayed, as demonstrated by case law. We are fortunate that three of our parishioners are on the council (Tim Wagner, Pete McGuinness, and Lou Signorino) and have supported our cause for the free expression of religion. God willing we will get better results through future elected officials. On the county level, I thank once again Freeholder Terry Duffy for his good work to end the bus stop in front of the parish. This was necessary after many times picking up trash, including liquor bottles, that were thrown by people waiting for the bus. On the Federal level, I wish that they would stop the yacking, and partisan bickering and get the job done. I think that the 2016 election proved one thing, and that was that people are tired of politics as normal, and things must change. We have so many issues to address in our country, and we have a world that faces almost weekly, if not daily terrorist attacks, rogue regimes in North Korea, and governments that are hostile to freedom and democracy. These issues must be addressed and it requires people elected in our federal government to work together.

7. Religious Freedom. It is both sad and sickening to see the attacks on people because of their faith. Until last Sunday night, all of the attacks have been aimed at Christians by Muslims. Last Sunday night, it was a clear attack on people leaving a mosque in London. The attack and hatred by those who wish to do terrorist attacks is not only shameful but wicked and evil. We must pray that this stops soon, and pray that the President, and world leaders, can destroy the hate. I may add that the hate against authority, especially the police, must also stop. The latest act is when a Muslim Canadian crossed over into the United States, drove to Michigan, and stabbed a police officer at the airport in Flint because he hated the United States, and he did it in the name of God. Really? God does not support hate, and a society without order is an anarchy.

8. Desire for the Lord. Desire to serve! Realize that God loves YOU! I beg you, the faithful, to get Jesus in your Life, and always remember that God calls us to Know, Love, and Serve Him. Be confident that the Lord of Mercy seeks you to embrace Him, and have a relationship with Him. God would like us to be part of the journey in life. In Him, we will find our joy.

In conclusion, some more thanks to offer:

I personally wish to thank the staff once again. We are blessed to be served by each of them for their good work.

I thank our Sisters who continue to be active in the parish. Their relationship through the years has been significant, and I thank them for that, as well as their kindness to me. We are blessed for their willingness to serve God as a religious sister.

For your future, you will be served by Fr. Hubert as your new Administrator. Fr. Hubert is ready to serve you and looks forward to it. Fr. Hubert has led the vocations office the last 6 years, and has had the responsibility for leading the largest amount of seminarians in recent history in the diocese. I wish him the very best, as well as my prayers, for his tenure at Queen of Peace.

So, as I say good-bye in my last article from the Pastor's Desk, I say thank you. You have kindly touched my heart, and were a part of my life. You know that I have said that the Church is not just the building but Church means its people. Your kindness extended to my Mom

when she visited was gratifying, and yes, even to Cupcake, my companion here at Queen of Peace. As I depart for my new assignment, I ask for your prayers for my success, and for being welcomed like you opened your hearts here. I face a challenge of following the diocese's longest serving Pastor, one for 29 years. As he retires, I, with God's help, will try to lead St. Jude's Parish in this new transition, and era. As I move about 32 minutes South and West, my new address will be:
