GIVE THANKS...PRAY FOR PEACE...

Tonight in our community members from six different congregations will gather for an ecumenical Thanksgiving Service. We as Americans uniquely celebrate this day as one of remembrance of God's blessings upon us. We know the story of the gathering of pilgrims and Indians (Native Americans). "In early autumn of 1621, the 53 surviving Pilgrims celebrated their successful harvest, as was the English custom. During this time, "many of the Indians coming... amongst the rest their great king Massasoit, with some ninety men." – quote from Pilgrim Hall in Massachusetts. From these simple events stories have increased over the past 400+ years and legends have grown. Each year the President since George Washington issues a Proclamation calling upon Americans to give thanks. For us as Christians giving thanks is what we do each time we gather to celebrate the Eucharist. We have much to be thankful for and we have much to intercede with God for in our world. We come together tonight just over a week since the world changing events that took place in Paris. The pursuit of peace and the end to violence and war and cruelty is something that has eluded almost every generation of the people who have lived on the earth. From the earliest days of human kind when tribal diversities caused us to sin, the peaceful moments have been few and far between. Almost each generation can recount an event that they felt was so catastrophic. It is unfortunate. Even Jesus witnessed the injustice and wars of his time. Yet in his time Jesus called us to be people of God. "Blessed are the Peacemakers for they will be called Children of God." The church in our liturgy each week prays for an end to evil and the establishment of peace. As we give thanks for the freedoms we enjoy, for the hopes and opportunities that we have in our country let us earnestly not forget to continue to pray for peace in our day. God always hears our prayers - may one day God's peace will come upon the earth and in each heart... Fr Joe
