THE POWER OF JESUS TO HEAL:

One of my favorite Gospels stories of healing comes from the gospel of St. John Chapter 5: 1-18. It is the story of how one day Jesus walked by a pool in Jerusalem where many of the sick used to be laid out. They believed if the waters were stirred it was done by an angel and the first one in would be cured. Jesus saw a man on his mat and he spoke with him and discovered the man had been there for 38 years. Jesus asked him if he wanted to be healed. The man said yes! Jesus said: "Rise, take up your mat and walk!" Jesus' word brought healing to the man. Jesus told him to stay away from sin so that something worse fall you. This is a great challenge to us this Lent. We all need healing in some way be it physical, spiritual or emotional. We might need healing in our relationships. We might know others who need healing. Put yourself in the story. Image you are the man on the mat and Jesus speaks to you and heals you. Let Jesus do that in your prayer this lent. Ask Jesus-God among us- to gift you with spiritual healing and peace. He can do it. As Isaiah the prophet told us in our first reading God says, "See I am doing something new" – be a new creation in Christ Jesus Lent. Open you heart to the power of Jesus...

THE CHAIRS...

I hope you noticed the new chairs along the side walls of the side transepts in the church. These 60 chairs were purchased with gifts that we received from the Knights of Columbus and Columbiettes of Long Valley Council. The Parish Advisory Board (PAC) was planning to get new chairs to eventually replace the 30 year old green chairs that were in use from the early days of St. Mark's when was mass celebrated in the hall for many years. The chairs most recently have been used by our CEC students as well as groups in our hall. We have a number of the green chairs left but each week one or two manage to get thrown out due to breakage. They certainly lasted a long time. We actually would like to add 60 more chairs and we are hoping that you will want to donate to a chair. The cost is \$30 a chair if we order another 60 chairs. The color green was no longer available as a standard color so we went with the burgundy. After 30 years I guess it was time for a change even among the chair makers. We hope to be able to raise enough money for the 60 chairs by the summer.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

God says not to remember the events from long ago, but to focus on the things he plans to do next. He also claims he will again help his chosen people when they need him.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:8-14

Paul describes knowledge of Jesus as more important than knowledge of the Old Law. He wishes to share in the power of Jesus' resurrection, and speaks of concentrating on the finish line of the race with salvation as the prize to be won.

Gospel: John 8:1-11

Jesus preached forgiveness of sin, but in the old law those accused of adultery were to be stoned. So the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus and brought a woman accused of adultery to him, asking him what he would do to her. Jesus asked that one without sin cast the first stone, and then all of the elders left. Jesus told the woman that he did not condemn her, but warned her to avoid such sin in the future
