DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY...

"Do we have mercy and forgiveness in our hearts? What is the danger? It is that we presume we are righteous and judge others. We also judge God, because we think that he should punish sinners, condemn them to death, instead of forgiving. . . . If in our heart there is no mercy, no joy of forgiveness, we are not in communion with God, even if we observe all of his precepts alone. It is love of God and neighbor that brings fulfillment to all the Commandments. And this is the love of God, his joy: forgiveness." — Pope Francis

These words of Pope Francis should challenge us to look into our hearts on this day when the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. How do we answer the question of the Holy Father. . . do we have mercy and forgiveness in our hearts? It is so important for us as Catholics to be models to others in these turbulent times. We have to speak the truth that comes to us from the Gospel in terms of respecting others; forgiving others and not judging others. The current climate of the world is toxic. People swing to extremes in almost everything from terrorism to political attacks; to disrespecting the rights of others and failing to make proper distinctions among people of different walks of life, cultures and judging others unfairly. We need to be people of mercy. We need to remember that the feast of Easter we celebrated last Sunday calls us to be renewed in the spirit of the Risen Lord and to be transformed into his disciples. Jesus and his way should always be our guide for our actions and words. The early Christians stood out even to those who did not believe as some exclaimed "see how these Christians love one another." Hopefully people will say that about us as we seek to bring the love and mercy of God to all people. . . Fr. Joe

The color green was no longer available as a standard color so we went with the burgundy. After 30 years I guess it was time for a change even among the chair makers. We hope to be able to raise enough money for the 60 chairs by the summer. If you would like to donate a chair(s) please make out a check to St Mark's Church. We will deposit the money in a separate fund until we have enough to cover the cost of an additional 60 chairs. We use these chairs in the parish center for various activities and an additional 60 would be very useful. . . Can we raise the amount by the summer?
