### **PENTECOST 2016...**

John 14:26 "The Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and remind you of all I have told, you says the Lord."

These words of Jesus to his disciples at the Last Supper were fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit, the promised one, came down upon the apostles in a rather dramatic way. The Acts of the Apostles relate how tongues of fire appear over their heads. They burst forth from the locked upper room speaking in various languages. The symbolism is not lost that the power of the Holy Spirit brings about a transformation for good. The power of the Holy Spirit goes forth into the whole world proclaiming the Good News that God loves his people. God loves us and sent Jesus his only son to die for the sins of all. God loves us and promises us that because Jesus rose from the dead we too share in the promise of eternal life with God.

Where is the Holy Spirit leading you in your life's journey? We might never have as dramatic a presence of the Holy Spirit as the apostles but we share in that same Spirit from the moment of our Baptism. Throughout our lives we turn to God and seek his gifts of courage, love, peace, kindness, mercy and so many more. Sometimes we forget that God gives his Spirit to anyone who acknowledges Jesus as Lord and all we have to do is ask in our prayer for the Holy Spirit to be present to us. Jesus told us he would not abandon us and the gift of the Holy Spirit is the presence of living among us and in our hearts. The Holy Spirit of God is the spiritual life-force within us that continually seeks to give us life in God through directing our thoughts and actions to always chose the good and reject the evil. The Holy Spirit within us reminds us of the Lord of God that is very close to us. The Holy Spirit urges us, like the first apostles, to go forth and by our words and deeds give witness for Jesus. This is our overall life mission. Sometimes we forget to seek the gifts of the Spirit and it is usually at these times that we begin to feel lost or alone or without direction. Today let us renew in our hearts the prayer of the Church today "Come Holy Spirit!"...Fr Joe

This weekend we take up the **Peter's Pence Collection**. Your contributions go directly to the fund for Pope Francis that he uses to continue the work of evangelization throughout the world.

**Ghana, West Africa Children's Shoes collection**...today is the children's shoes collection for a small village in Ghana, West Africa. Thank you for your donations to help make life easier for the children.

On the weekend of May 28-29 – Memorial Day weekend – also the Feast of Corpus Christi – we again as a diocese are having a **diocesan wide food collection** to help stock the 9 Catholic Charity food pantries located in various areas of the diocese. Each parish is assigned a food item to bring to church which will be transported to one of the local food outlet pantries. Bishop Serratelli has written that through this food collection we supply"... food for literally thousands of our brothers and sisters in genuine need - particularly their children." Both Our Lady of the Mountain and St. Mark's parishioners are asked to bring **1 to 5 pounds of rice** to church and leave them in the gathering space.
