When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem, - Luke 9:51

These words of today's Gospel begins Jesus' journey to Jerusalem – the city where he will be acclaimed as king and then suffer crucifixion in the same week. During this journey, St. Luke presents different random events, encounters and responses of Jesus. Today we hear how the disciples wanted to call fire and brimstone upon those they perceived were their enemies. Jesus just ignores them and keeps moving forward. Another pledges he will follow Jesus wherever he goes and Jesus replies he does not know where he will lay his head that night. Finally he invites someone to follow but he can't make the immediate decision. Another wants to come but wants time. Jesus leaves them both and continues his mission. He teaches us that whoever really is his disciple will also follow him fully committed to making the journey with him. Do our daily actions, our prayer, our concern for others show that we are committed disciples of Jesus? Does my commitment to Jesus come with conditions or reservations? ... Just something that we need to reflect upon on a regular basis in order to keep on the same road as Jesus...Fr. Joe

YEAR OF MERCY --- POPE FRANCIS ... "Experience shows that an appeal to justice alone will result in its destruction." This is why God goes beyond justice with his mercy and forgiveness. Yet this does not mean that justice should be devalued or rendered superfluous. On the contrary: anyone who makes a mistake must pay the price. However, this is just the beginning of conversion, not its end, because one begins to feel the tenderness and mercy of God. God does not deny justice. He rather envelops it and surpasses it with an even greater event in which we experience love as the foundation of true justice." — Pope Francis

"Love rejoices in the other" - "...in other words love rejoices in the right...we rejoice at the good of others when we see their dignity and value their abilities and good works. This is impossible for those who must always be comparing and competing even with their spouse, so that they secretly rejoice in their failure.

When a loving person can do good for others, or see that others are happy, they themselves live happily and in this way give glory to God, 'for God loves a cheerful giver' (2 Corinthians 9:7). Our Lord especially appreciates those who find joy in the happiness of others. If we fail to learn how to rejoice in the well-being of others and focus primarily on our own needs, we condemn ourselves to a joyless existence...the family must always be the place when something good happens to one of its members they know that others will be there to celebrate in with them. #109-110 Joy of Love
