WHY WE ARE CATHOLIC

We are Catholic because we believe: Beginning with the Easter Triduum as its source of light, the new age of the Resurrection fills the whole liturgical year with its brilliance. Gradually, on either side of this source, the year is transfigured by the liturgy. It really is a "year of the Lord's favor." The economy of salvation is at work within the framework of time, but since its fulfillment in the Passover of Jesus and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the culmination of history is anticipated "as a foretaste," and the kingdom of God enters into our time. Therefore Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the "Feast of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities," just as the Eucharist is the "Sacrament of sacraments" (the Great Sacrament). Holy Thursday April 13 – only one mass this day –**Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Supper**... 7:30 p.m. during this mass the holy oils will be presented and feet will be washed as a sign of Jesus the Servant. After mass there will be a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to our daily mass chapel and you are welcome to spend some time in prayer. At 10 a.m. we will recite the church Night Prayer to end our evening at 10:15 p.m.

Good Friday – April 14

CROSS WALK...each church of the ecumenical clergy group will be participating. We encourage you to join with members of the different congregations at 11:45 a.m. at the Presbyterian Church on Bartley Road near Ort Farm. We will walk from there to the Zion Lutheran church at the bottom of Schooley's Mt. Road. Along the way we will stop for brief reflections given by a representative of each church. Members of the church will carry the cross for a distance between the two stops.
