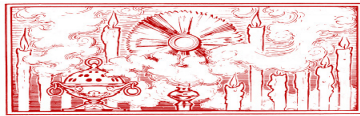

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi

This Sunday the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known by its Latin title, Corpus Christi. It is an occasion every year to remember especially what a great gift Jesus left us in the Holy Eucharist – the abiding sign of His Redemption and His Presence among us. Today we celebrate the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist. The bread and wine become for us the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus.

We all want to meet Jesus. We want to have a closer friendship with Jesus. We want to have more of Jesus in our lives. We have to come to the right place, to the Eucharist. The best place to meet Jesus is in the Eucharist. If you want to be intimate with Jesus he tells us how: Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. (John 6:56). Our most intimate moment with Jesus is when we receive Jesus in Holy Communion. We receive Jesus into our very bodies. We could not be closer with Jesus. **We are one.** Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. (John 6:56).

We are blessed in that we have the ability to receive the Body and Blood of Christ every week, if not every day, and of praying before the Tabernacle. Jesus is the Bread of Life, and in the Eucharist he gives us himself so that we may have life. Do we take the Real Presence for granted? Maybe we could be more mindful of his presence when we enter a church or chapel. Maybe as we walk up the aisle for Holy Communion we can be more mindful, not of what we are about to receive, but of who we are about to receive.

From a Letter on the Eucharist (Ecclesia de Eucharistia) – John Paul II (2003):

The Eucharist is at the center of the Church (§3). The Church was born at Pentecost but a decisive moment in the shaping of the Church was the institution of the Eucharist in the Upper Room during the Last Supper (§5). What more could Jesus have done for us? In the Eucharist Jesus shows a love which goes to the end and knows no measure (§11). Our relationship with Christ begins at baptism and is strengthened by the Eucharist (§22). Whenever Mass is celebrated we are led back in spirit to Calvary (§4). The Mass makes present the sacrifice of the Cross, it does not add to it or multiply it but makes Christ's sacrifice present in time. The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice (§12).

We talk of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist because Jesus' presence in the Eucharist is a presence in the fullest sense, where Jesus is wholly and entirely present. The consecration at Mass changes the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ and the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood and the Church calls this change transubstantiation (§15).



Today's celebration of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, is the feast of the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of our faith, and the center and heart of parish, the center and heart of the lives of each of us, Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

May Jesus in the Eucharist always be the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of our faith, the center and heart of our parish, and the center and heart of the lives of each of us.

**TEACHING FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH –
THE TEN COMMANDMENTS
The Ninth Commandment**

You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant, or his maidservant, or his ox, or his ass, or anything that is your neighbor's.

My dear brothers and sisters according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church the ninth commandment talks about the purification of the Heart, in the numeral 2517 says: *"The heart is the seat of moral personality: "Out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, and adultery, fornication...." The struggle against carnal covetousness entails purifying the heart and practicing temperance"*:

Remain simple and innocent, and you will be like little children who do not know the evil that destroys man's life.

Also the sixth beatitude proclaims, *"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God."* "Pure in heart" refers to those who have attuned their intellects and wills to the demands of God's holiness, chiefly in three areas: charity; chastity or sexual rectitude; love of truth and orthodoxy of faith. There is a connection between purity of heart, of body, and of faith:

All of us must believe the articles of the Creed *"so that by believing they may obey God, by obeying may live well, by living well may purify their hearts, and with pure hearts may understand what they believe"*.
