From the Director of Religious Education

Dear Parishioners.

On Tuesday, October 30th, our Jr. High Program met for their regular classes. With All Saint's Day so close the classes took time to talk about the special people in the history of our church that we refer to as saints. They learned that these special people are "called" by God to share their gifts and talents for the good of our faith and in service to others. It was discussed that while these people were called to their special lives, they also had a choice to accept that call and to live out their lives sometimes to tragic ends. An explanation of how some "gifts" are associated with particular Saints and how this has prompted us to pray for their intercession in these areas helped students understand the relationship we have with the Saints.

We are all called to live holy lives by virtue of our baptism. Like the Saints we are called to share the gifts God has given to us to help others. We should strive to answer the call of God when it comes to us and to make good choices in using the talents God has given us. The class followed with an activity where they wrote their name and the name of their Saint on a paper flame, one symbol for the Holy Spirit. They created a mobile by attaching these "flames" to a white dove as a symbol of the way God calls us through the Spirit to be closer to Him.

Madonna Cemetery and Mausoleum News

Madonna Cemetery has an addition to our existing Mausoleum, the first community mausoleum built in the Archdiocese of Newark, has served the needs of our local community for over forty years. The construction of an addition was necessary if we hoped to continue in this mission.

The new expansion is called the "All Saints" section and there are several liturgical features of saints that represent the ethnic diversity of our community. There are also private and semi-private areas in the mausoleum addition and there are options for both single and double internment.

Because we believe that pre-planning is an important family responsibility, we are offering cemetery counseling and information about the mausoleum.
