From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

On February 2nd, the Church celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus and is also known as Candlemas (candle mass) day, since the blessing of candles is included in today's liturgy. Parishioners are encouraged to bring candles from home to be blessed that they will use in their homes for religious purposes on **Saturday**, **February 2nd**, **at the 8:00 AM Mass**. Also the candles used for liturgy at St. Mary's will be blessed.

The Feast of St. Blase and Blessing of Throats -

The blessing of the sick by ministers of the Church is a very ancient custom, rooted in imitation of Christ himself and his apostles.

In the United States the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian. This blessing will be given during Masses; on February 2nd the 5:00 PM Mass and all masses on February 3rd.

Saint Blase was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century and is the patron saint of those suffering afflictions of the throat.

Parish Registry



St. Mary's Pastoral Council Nominations

The Parish Staff and Father Joe, our pastor, wish to re-institute the Parish Pastoral Council which acts as a *consultative* body, pastoral in nature, because it strives to discern the movement of the Holy Spirit among God's people in the parish. A Parish Pastoral Council gives its help to the Pastor in fostering pastoral activity; it evaluates, under the leadership of the Pastor, all those things which pertain to pastoral works to ponder them, and to propose practical conclusions about them. (The Pastoral Council's responsibilities do not include consulting on administrative areas.)

Specifically, the Parish Pastoral Council's purpose is to enhance the process of:

- pastoral planning
- developing pastoral programs
- improving pastoral services
- evaluating the pastoral effectiveness of various programs and services

Council members serve a two-year term, renewable once; or one three-year term. Meetings are held once every other month.

We are accepting nominations of parishioners to serve on the council. Serving on the council is a ministry to the *whole parish*. When considering membership on the council, the following criteria should be kept in mind. Potential candidates should be:

- of proven faith,
- with sound morals,
- demonstrating the gifts of wisdom and prudence,
- willing to commit their time, talent and wisdom in a consultative and collaborative manner,
- those who participate in the Mass and sacraments at St. Mary's, being registered and active members of the parish.

Council members should have the ability to study and reflect prayerfully, and to recognize and respect the viewpoints of others.

Official Church documents state that the Pastoral Councils are to represent the people of God, but not in the legal sense. Rather, council members are representative in that they are a witness or a sign of the whole community. They make its wisdom present. (Sacred Congregation for the Clergy, *Private letter on Pastoral Councils*, # 7).

The Pastoral Council is a representative body rather than a body of representatives. A council member is *not* a representative for a particular ministry or parish group, a certain age bracket, special interest group or other religious or non-parish organizations.
