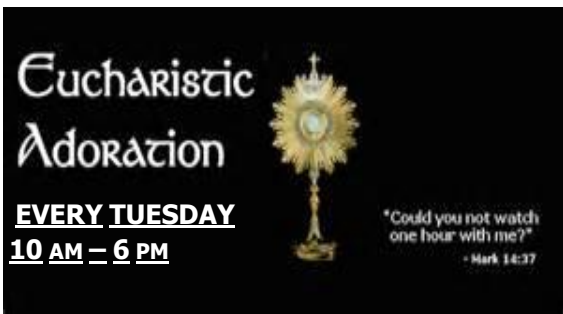

Ethics and Integrity in Ministry:

We highly value the many volunteers who, through their generous giving of time, talent, and treasure, enrich our parish, and serve our children and vulnerable adults. In complying with diocesan policy regarding the Ethics and Integrity in Ministry program and setting a higher standard for ourselves, all those in volunteer positions that involve work or service in ministries, programs or organizations, must become and remain EIM compliant. Ministry with minors and/or vulnerable adults pertains to any ministry, program, or organization that serves youth or vulnerable adults in any manner or which functions at a time and place where minors or vulnerable adults are typically present. A listing of such ministries/programs or organizations includes, but is not limited to: Communion ministry, choir, home bound, Altar Society, Religious Education, Bible study, Fundraiser events, BVS, and transportation ministries.

Call to Protect Youth:

We are all Called to Protect.

As Catholics, we believe that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God. Each of us is sacred and our lives — body, mind and soul — should be treated with respect. *Called to Protect for Youth* is a sexual abuse education and

prevention program that gives our young people practical tools, in language and a medium they can understand, to realize this fundamental teaching of our faith.

Called to Protect for Youth is a comprehensive program specifically designed to teach middle school and high school aged youth how to protect themselves from child molesters. Research shows that child molesters use the same methods time after time, and the more youth know about how molesters operate, the safer they become. CTPY workshops are facilitated by diocesan trained volunteers and the format includes a three-part DVD series, activities (e.g. making posters or creating a skit) and discussion to reinforce the information presented in the DVD.

Each parish and Catholic school in the Diocese of Austin is **required** to present *Called to Protect for Youth* to their students from 6th to 12th grade who have never attended a workshop, and 6th and 9th graders **every school year** (all middle and high school grades will attend these workshops at St. Francis of Assisi).

Students and their parents should understand the importance of this program as part of their education about boundaries, appropriate interactions between adults and minors and related personal safety issues. This should not be considered an optional program; students that cannot attend should have a valid reason for their absence. Parents may choose to complete a waiver to excuse their child from the program; this can be obtained from the parish/school representative organizing the session. Students that do not attend are not required to "make up" the session and are not prohibited from participating in ministry, but parents may be asked to provide supervision for their child during the session. Parents of students that do not attend the CTPY program may use the links below to review this important information with their child.
