Message from Our Pastor

In today's gospel, Jesus strongly and clearly teaches that He is literally the revealed Word of God the Father, and He gives his preaching and his body and blood to others as divine gifts for eternal life.

EXEGESIS:

More than one word for "flesh/body" and for "eat" are available in Greek to John when he writes these verses. He chooses words which strongly emphasize the physical reality of these two topics--e.g., for "eat," he writes (in Greek) "munch" or "gnaw," which indicates a slow process of focusing on the realness and delightfulness of the food at hand. In other words, John (and Jesus) are highlighting the literalness, not merely the symbolism, of eating and drinking Jesus' Eucharistic body and blood. "Living bread" also refers to the revelation preached by Jesus. Some of the Jews hearing this wisely understand Jesus to be speaking literally, and they are repelled by this teaching (in contrast to most Protestants later in Church history, who will interpret Jesus only symbolically).

Again, Jesus in John's gospel points to the intimate relationship between Him and God the Father, then draws his listeners into this relationship by his promise of eternal life to those who believe and act accordingly.
