Message from Our Pastor

It is by the spoken word that Jesus heals a man who cannot speak properly. And, as in most of Jesus' miracles, words are accompanied by his personal touch. So too the sacraments of the Church combine spoken prayers and personal touch to convey spiritual healing or nourishment.

EXEGESIS:

Jesus takes an unusually roundabout route from Tyre to the Decapolis in Galilee (Northern Israel). This could be Mark's indication to his audience that the young Church, at the time of his writing, must also be missionary. Jesus has had more success preaching and healing in Galilee, so the crowd brings a handicapped man to Him. The Greek words used indicate that the man is partially, not completely, deaf and mute. Jesus looks to heaven and "groans" (actually "cries with compassion") while performing a brief ritual on him, then heals him with a brief command. (Jesus' posture and words here are similar to those He will use when crying and praying over his dead friend, Lazarus.) A sense of quality and completeness for the miracle (a real one, not merely magic) is indicated by the verses. Because the crowds have been interested primarily in his healing power and not sufficiently attentive to his teachings, He orders the people not to keep talking about only his miracles, but they do not obey Him.
