Message from Our Pastor

In today's gospel, Jesus challenges another popular social value or belief in Jewish society. He indicates how his followers (and us) can be obedient disciples who will be ultimately rewarded, because "All things are possible with God." EXEGESIS:

A rich man (Matthew calls him "young," Mark does not) approaches Jesus to ask about eternal life (equivalent to "kingdom of God"). "Good teacher" is exaggerated flattery in that society, so Jesus deflects the source of all goodness from himself to God the Father. In reply, Jesus omits the first three Commandments of God because, as a Jew, the rich man would already be obeying them. Rather, He focuses on the latter Commandments which describe treatment of others. Sensing the rich man's sincere reply, Jesus calls him to a higher state of spiritual perfection by inviting him to sell his riches and become Jesus' disciple. The man sadly declines, and when Jesus comments on how difficult it is for a rich person to enter the kingdom, everyone is surprised--because in ancient Judaism riches were viewed as God's blessing for being a good Jew. No, implies Jesus, speaking with Oriental hyperbole regarding the camel and the needle's eye, the rich will have a difficult time. But He quickly encourages his audience by telling them that, if they will be his devoted disciples who are not preoccupied with wealth and power, they will be greatly rewarded (after some persecution) in the kingdom to come.
