## DEAR PARISHIONERS OF ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA CHURCH & ANNUNCIATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY CHURCH,

### Visiting Cemeteries and Praying for the Dead [Please find the Cemetery Blessing Schedule in the Bulletin.]

From All Souls Day until the First Sunday of Advent the Catholic custom of visiting cemeteries and praying for our deceased is practiced. We have traditionally called *All Souls Day, November 2<sup>nd</sup> - le Jour des Morts, Dia de los Muertos, the Day of the Dead.*

I encourage Grandparents to bring grandchildren to visit the graves of family members. This way the grandchildren will know family members and know where they are buried.

In visiting the graves of our loved ones and in visiting the cemeteries, we do it in reverence, respect, love and care. Their bodies were temples of the Holy Spirit. While their souls live on in God's care, their remains rest in the cemetery waiting for the General Resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. When we visit the cemetery and the grave of our loved ones, we can say a simple prayer:

Eternal rest grant unto him/her/them, O Lord.

**R.** And let perpetual light shine upon him/her/them.

May he/she/they rest in peace.

**R.** Amen.

May his/her/their soul(s) and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

**R.** Amen.

Follow with one Our Father prayer, one Hail Mary prayer, and one Glory Be prayer.

### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

#### CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

**Question:** Would optional celibacy help the priest shortage?

**Answer:** This is a hotly debated topic. There are good arguments on both sides, and there is no clear answer that emerges. However, the shortage of clergy in denominations that do allow marriage would seem to indicate that optional celibacy is not the quick answer that some might think. No one solution is perfect. Each one has its flaws and problems that are not easily solved. While optional celibacy would open ordination to some great men who are married, it also brings the problems of family, financial support, marital problems, and issues—good and bad—of childrearing. So it would not seem that optional celibacy is a realistic solution to the shortage of clergy.

With all of the varied challenges and problems facing the

Church, it is easy to forget that the Holy Spirit leads us. Openness, dialogue, and education are rooted in our prayers and petitions to the Holy Spirit to make clear the path the Church should follow. A response that is rooted in a culture of political correctness is almost certainly doomed; a response that is rooted in prayer and in God cannot fail.

Perhaps we should look at the need for Catholics to seek a greater conversion of life in the Lord Jesus where we fall in love with Christ and strive to mold our lives around his attitude of doing the Heavenly Father's will. When we see that in our secular culture, married couples are the minority: (1) there does not seem to be a need for marriage in our society today. (2) Like wise there does not seem to be a need for celibacy today. People who follow Jesus Christ as lord and savior need to embrace Christ's attitude that marriage is a call by God for a man and a woman to be united in a union that is a sacrament. They are called together to service in the Church, a service that helps the communion of the church. Single people are also called to grow in an attitude of celibacy where we are living life as in heaven. From single people, God calls some to marriage and God calls some to give up marriage for the sake of the Kingdom of God. All the baptized should encourage these two dimensions of our life in God. Let our love of God move us to respond freely and with courageous charity to a life lived for God.

### Gospel for the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A – Matthew 22:34-40

*"The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."* Jesus gives us a simple moral principle in today's Gospel. He speaks about two kinds of love: love of God and love of neighbor. He tells us that all the other laws and teachings of our faith fall under these two headings. So if we can master these, we will be in good spiritual shape!

First of all, regarding the love of God, Jesus tells us in essence that we must love God completely and entirely, with our whole being—heart, soul, and mind. If we are holding back from a full commitment to God, then we are falling short of this vision. So we would do well to examine ourselves and find those trouble spots where we are hesitant to give God everything. Is there a relationship we hold in our heart that is somehow separating us from God, either by negative association, lingering bitterness, or a kind of idol-worship of the relationship itself? What about our souls? Are we deeply attached to any pastimes, pleasures, or pursuits that cloud our soul from clearly welcoming the presence of God? An examination of our minds is in order as well. How do we direct our thoughts? Do we strive to form our conscience and understanding

The more we are filled with God's love, the more that love radiates out to those around us, and the less we concern ourselves about what we can get out of the deal. So let us truly love God, and all the rest will follow.

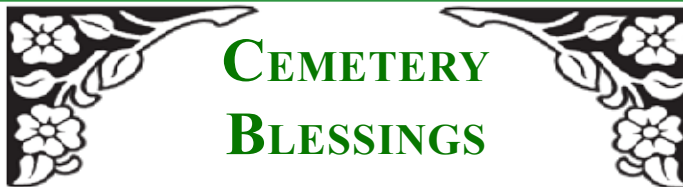
