LITURGY CORNER

Tabernacle

The tabernacle is the place to reserve consecrated Body of Christ for two reasons only: to have Communion available for those who are sick or shut-in and unable to attend Mass and for those near death in need of viaticum. We are not meant to keep hosts there when too many have been consecrated at a particular Mass and then use them for the next Mass. Rather, we are all meant to partake of consecrated hosts from the Mass at which we participate; in other words the tabernacle is not a holy holding place! In the General Instruction (GIRM) we read: *"It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the Priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass. Communion may stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated."* #85. At St. Basil's we try our best to do this by consecrating only enough hosts at any one Mass for the number of attendees.
