### **JUST ONE OF THE COUNTLESS REASONS YOU ARE THE GREATEST PARISH IN THE WORLD AND WHY I AM SO PROUD OF YOU.**

Throughout the year you frequently hear us speak of our "Housing the Homeless" Ministry; a ministry we share with several other Christian Churches in the Great Pasadena Area. It consists in our taking care of around 35 or 40 men and/or women of the community for one week who would otherwise be homeless were it not for us.

They will arrive on the 16th of January around dinner time when they will receive dinner and enjoy the hospitality of TV, reading, board games and conversation. They will sleep in the gathering place and the next morning go off to work with a lunch prepared by the students at Bodkin Elementary. At day's end they return for dinner and another good night's sleep.

Sounds simple but the all-year-long preparation is a Herculean effort on the part of literally scores of parishioners who find the project a labor of love and affection for those less blessed than we. Meals are prepared from scratch (one night prepared by the Ladies of Galilee Lutheran Church) for breakfast and dinner worthy of a Five Star Hotel.

Stop by if you like to shake hands with our guests. This is a ministry that radiates and brings life to Jesus' words that blessed are they who care for and house and feed. . . . and you know the rest!
