Dear Friends of Our Lady of the Chesapeake,

This weekend, OLC will TAKE THE NEXT STEP when it comes to our stewardship commitment. As I mentioned last weekend, I know some parishioners are upset with the recent crisis in our Church and have decided to withhold or suspend their support. And I respect your decision. Our Church is certainly in need of reform and renewal, and unfortunately, it will take some time for this to happen. However, in the meantime, OLC still needs to pay its bills and pay the salaries and benefits for its staff, which has become more difficult to do over the past three years. That is why I am asking everyone who is financially able to TAKE THE NEXT STEP and commit to making a small increase in your stewardship offering each week. I have taken the next step and increased my giving by 6.7%, or \$10 a month. I invite you to take a step in the same direction. Thank you for your prayers, support, and generosity to OLC.

From the Desk of Sister Sally:

Jesus told the disciples that the way to rank first is by serving others. What does unselfish service look like in your parish, work, or home? Could it change the world? How?

"Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant ... " In this quotation from his United Nations address below, where does Pope Francis say the full meaning of individual and collective life is found? Why does Jesus attribute so much importance to the emptying of oneself?

The common home of all men and women must continue to rise on the foundations of a right understanding of universal fraternity and respect for the sacredness of every human life, of every man and every woman, the poor, the elderly, children, the infirm, the unborn, the unemployed, the abandoned, those considered disposable because they are only considered as part of a statistic. This common home of all men and women must also be built on the understanding of a certain sacredness of created nature.

Such understanding and respect call for a higher degree of wisdom, one which accepts transcendence, rejects the creation of an all-powerful élite, and recognizes that the full meaning of individual and collective life is found in selfless service to others and in the sage and respectful use of creation for the common good. To repeat the words of Paul VI, "the edifice of modern civilization has to be built on spiritual principles, for they are the only ones capable not only of supporting it, but of shedding light on it."



High School Youth Ministry AND Confirmation

Last Sunday, Oct. 14th, we continued our session called "Be Open to Jesus", which ties into Fr. Steve's homily series. Fr. Steve pointed out that in today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the need for us to **BE OPEN to Supporting the Mission**... to place the Good News of God's love for the world through Jesus Christ first and foremost in our lives. We can tell you that every Sunday evening, but we should only be reiterating what you are being told and what you experience at home...in your domestic church...in the life of your family and the example of your parents. Tonight the students had the opportunity to reflect on their own domestic churches, and then share with their small groups.
