

Slowly read Sacred Scripture until something hits you. Then listen. Say the Holy Rosary. If you can't say 15 decades, say five decades. If you can't say five decades, say one decade. If you can't say one decade, say one Hail Mary very slowly.

## All Souls Day

Masses: 8 a.m., 12 p.m., 5:30 p.m. all at the church.

All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. It is different from All Saints Day where we celebrate those who are already in heaven because All Souls Day is a day to pray for *all* who have died. This includes those in purgatory.



It is our belief that the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser sin, or venial sin, must go. In Purgatory, souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

**1032** This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." (2 Macc 12:46.)

From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. (Cf. Council of Lyons II, 1274: DS 856.)

The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead (see 958, 1371, 1479 in the Catechism).



If you haven't listed your loved ones in our book of remembrance, it's not too late! Please stop and list the names on your way out of Mass. You may list loved ones throughout out the year by contacting the parish office.

#### November Canned Food Drive

Our parish family is putting mercy into action through the month of November. We encourage every family to bring non-perishable food items in through the month of November.



For the Plain City Food Pantry: There are drop off bins at the PAC and at the back of the church.

Sufficient Grace: PSR Kids! You are part of this food drive in a special way. Your donations of lunch type

food items can be put in the Sufficient Grace boxes and will go to hungry kids in Plain City and West Jefferson.

Our parish has a history of being very generous. We thank you in advance for any support for these two organizations that perform the corporal work of mercy, Feed the Hungry.

Plain City Food Pantry = In the first 6 months of 2015 the pantry served an average of 250 household a month and an average of 300 children.

Sufficient Grace = Feeds about 100 children in two school districts.

#### Saint of the Week:

#### St. Martin de Porres

**Born:** December 9, 1579 **Died:** November 3, 1639 **Memorial:** November 3 **Canonized:** May 6, 1962

Martin was an illegitimate son of a Spanish nobleman and a young freed slave. He grew up in extreme poverty. At age 11, he became servant in the Holy Rosary

Dominican priory. He was promoted to one who collects donations and would bring home thousands of dollars a week for the poor and sick of Lima, Peru. Eventually, he was put in charge of the infirmary and was known for his tender care of sick. His superiors dropped the stipulation that "no black person may be received to the holy habit or profession of our Order" and Martin took vows as a Dominican brother in 1603. As a member, he established an orphanage and a children's hospital. He lived in self imposed austerity and constantly prayed and fasted. He had a great devotion to the Holy Eucharist.
