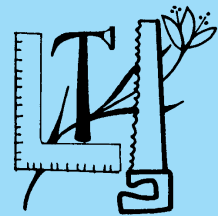
SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Arrangements must be made at least six months in advance of intended date. A marriage preparation program is required. Please contact Father Trapp.

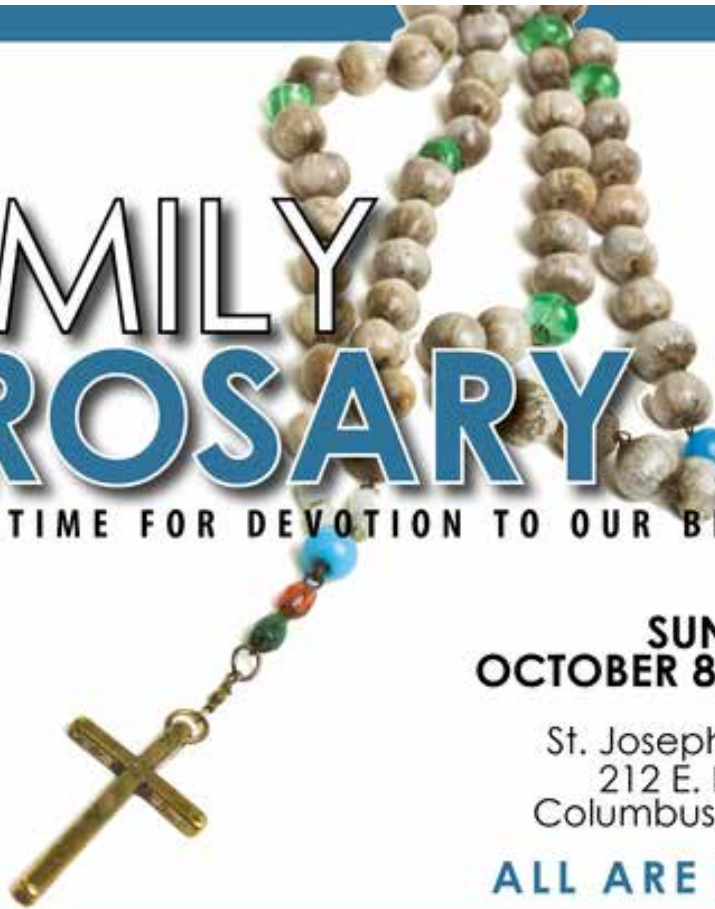
Pride and ego are hard things to control. We see

For the PSR Works of Mercy project this school year **each classroom** will be collecting loose change to fill their jars. **The collections will be on the 1st Monday of each month.**



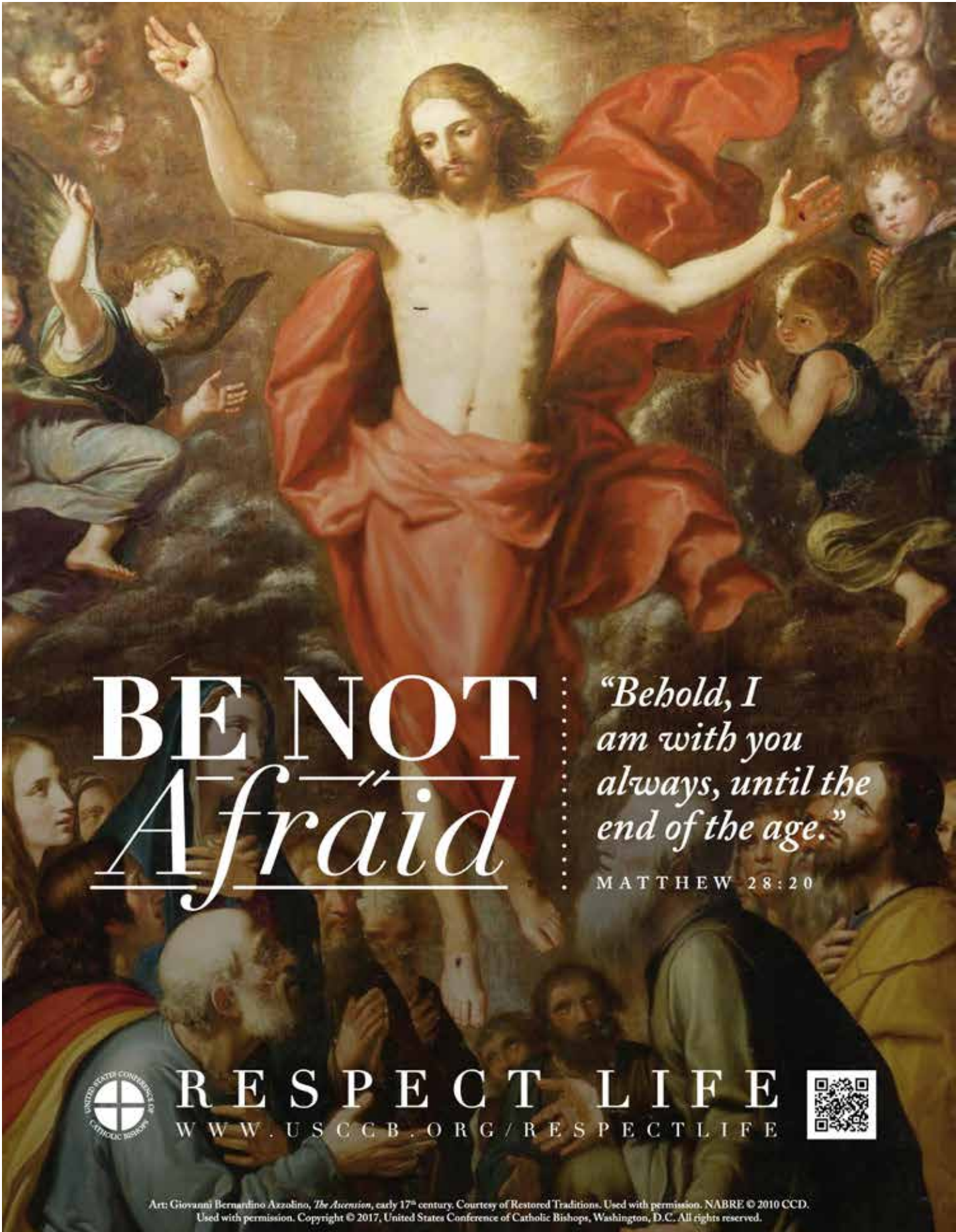
At the end of the school year the classroom from each session (4:30 & 6:30) will earn a pizza party for their class.

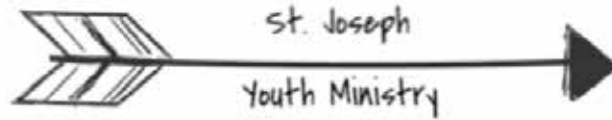

We are very excited to introduce YDisciple! YDisciple is an intuitive online platform designed to help parents and parishes work together to reach more teens more effectively with the Gospel. Our parish will offer training, streaming video content, well-crafted leader guides, and more to work with parents as we establish solid small groups that empower young disciples.

How Does YDisciple Work?

1. Talk with your teen about the importance of faith and how empowering it can be to be surrounded by other faith filled teens.
2. Have your teen invite a friend or two (or more!) that they would be interested in building a small group with. If they are uninterested in bringing a friend, don't worry. We will place them in a group of teens the same age, and soon they will have a new group of friends! Prayerfully, and with the help of parents, we will place the teens in groups with a mentor.
3. Consider being a part of the program yourself. Whether its for your own teens group or another group. Mentors are the key to success in small group ministry. We would love to have your help!
4. Bring your teen and their friends on Sunday September 17th to the PAC from 7:00-8:00pm. We will form small groups that will learn and encourage one another for the six session lesson "Follow Me".
5. Continue the next session and evaluate what works. We want to share the Gospel while helping teens and their families. Share with us what we can do to empower parents and teens in their faith journey.
