There has been about \$12,000 raised for the year. They have discontinued selling on Thursday afternoons. They are planning on a spring promotion.

0817 Parish Council Report-Nichole Campbell

There are 12 people in RCIA and receiving Sacraments for the first time this coming Easter. Hispanic Ministries has a large number of volunteers this year. They are currently addressing immigration and human rights issues. Sacred Heart Church will be doing another coffee with cops this coming spring. The recent Woman's Guild bake sale was their most successful to date. The church is organizing The Storybook Project, which is for children of incarcerated individuals.

0821 Auction Report-Lisa Schwarte

Net profit is accurate to within about \$1,000. There was \$20,000 made from the live auction and \$23,000 made from the silent auction. The committee did a nice job minimizing expenses. The profit is \$83,000 and is considered successful. Past auction profit has been around \$70,000.

0826 Principal Report-Scott Ehlinger

The survey that was compiled from parents, staff, and grades 5-8 was based on a scale of 1-5. Sacred Heart received a score of 4.2. The national average is 4.14. We had a great response rate on the survey >60%. He is not yet aware of any Diocesan wide results. There was a discussion on how to strengthen the presentation of Sacred Heart School and Sacred Heart Church together as one. Scott is going to look into enhancing the school's update in the church bulletin. There was a discussion on a need for the update to be more frequent and also more informative. The middle school What I Need (WIN) program is going well. Tier 1&2 are reading and math support. Other students can choose a traditional study hall or go to the library. There is also keyboarding and testing for keyboarding.
