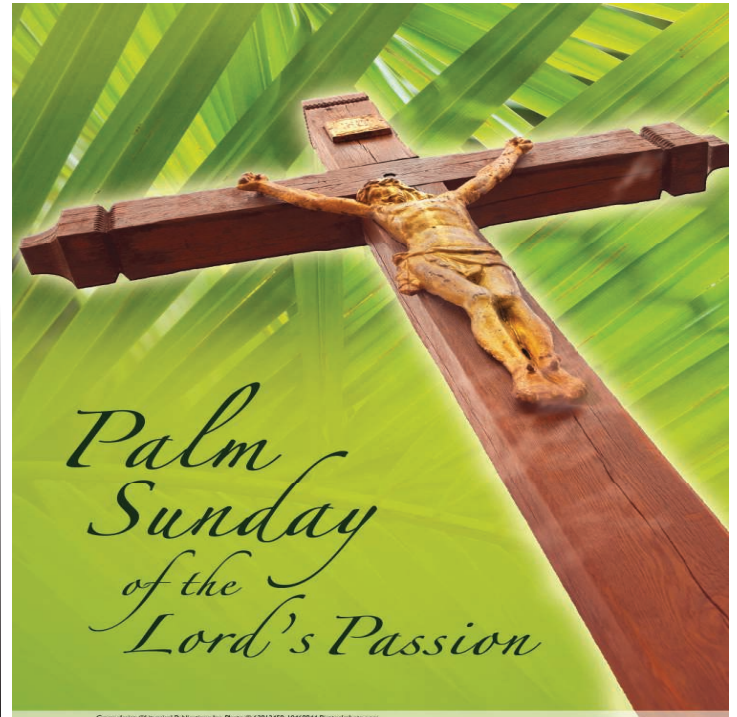

pastor's Corner

Dear family,

Today we enter the most sacred time of the whole Church year. This is the very core and center of our faith we celebrate these hallowed days to come. However, I want to offer all of you a note of caution about celebrating these days. Like watching a classic movie we have seen so many times, there is a temptation to just put our minds on autopilot. After all, we know that Jesus will rise from the dead and so I feel that sometime we treat everything leading to the Resurrection, like Jesus' passion and death like some sort of a bad dream that we will wake up from, but it wasn't.

Just as forgiveness is not nearly as powerful unless the wrong done to one has been acknowledged, so Easter Sunday has much more meaning viewed from and through Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday. When we see both the ugliest depths which humanity can stoop too and realize God's abiding love in the midst of it all, then we see the great victory of Easter. Because Easter is not a happy ending to a sad story, but it is a triumph over evil, real evil, that is found in our hearts, in society and in the mind of the evil one. As we follow along with the Gospel today, notice all of the moments where people decide to act like cowards instead of facing the truth. Pilate decides, against his intuition, that he will just do what the crowd wants. In this way he does not have to argue with his constituents and still keeps his reputation. And the crowd, well they do what most crowds do when fear and hysteria are present: they give up their courage and minds. Christians are called to reject and fight all forms of evil and to follow Christ. This is not the easiest way to live, certainly, but it is the most authentic which leads to eternal and divine life.
