


ST. PHILOMENA ADORATION CHAPEL

Pastor's Corner

Dear family.

I am constantly surprised by the volatile situation so much of this world is in right now. On the one hand we are so fragile and everyone so easily offended but on the other so many are filled with anger and by their unchecked rage fuel the anxiety even more. This environment has created the perfect social storm. If we are not worried about terrorists attacking us from a distant land than we are worried and suspicious of our own neighbor. In many ways I admire you among my parishioners that are raising children in such a polarized climate where people seem to have forgotten how to argue rationally and there is much reason to be cautious. What do we do about this as a Church, yes, as a Church? Well, we may not solve all the world's problems, but I guarantee if the entire Church rose up and worked hard at the Gospel virtues, this would be a less divided world. Take, for instance, how St. Paul addresses married couples in the second reading today. Harking back to Genesis and the teaching of Jesus Himself, Paul gives advice about how marriage is a mystery which is meant to mimic the mystery of the Church and Christ. The wife is a steward who supports her husband and allows him to lead the family in a certain way. In turn, each husband is called to love his wife as "Christ loved the Church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her..." "So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies."

In Paul's view, Christian couples are called to live as one, each showing deference, respect and love for the other. More than this, they are called to such a great level of compassion that they consider everything as a unit, a little community held together by Spirit of God. I wonder how many of the problems that arise in our society would be greatly lessened if each Christian couple truly strived to live this. I wonder how many hearts would be converted if they saw this example of our Faith lived in everyday life. The truth is, the call of the Gospel is for each of us to live these virtues to some extent in all our relationships. The Church has often had some of the greatest saints come from times not much different from our own and shine the light of Christ. There is no shortage of darkness these days, where is our light dear ones? Are we ready to shine? In His joy, Fr. Daniel


