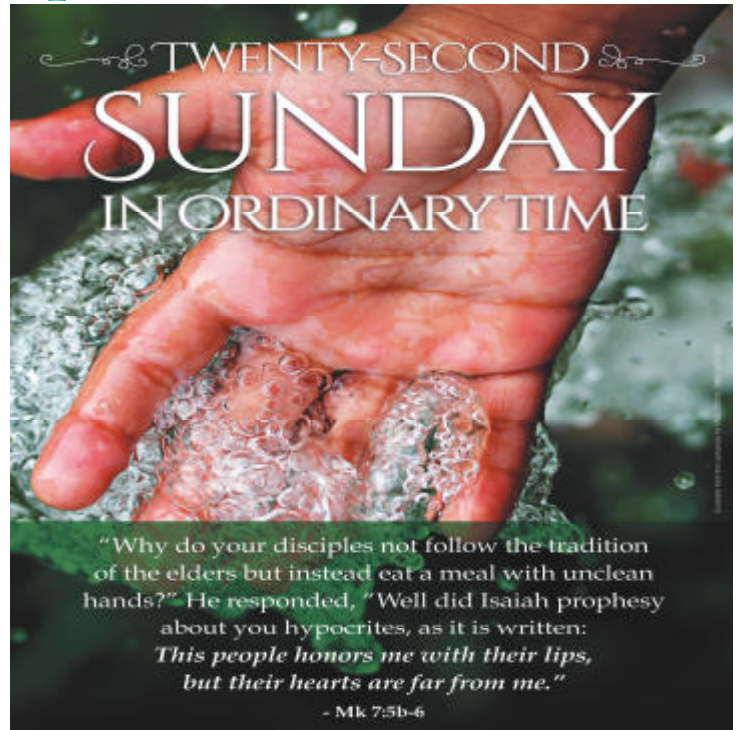

pastor's Corner

Dear family,

I can tell you there are many joys to living my vocation, but also many unique challenges. Among these challenges are times when I am spotted having a drink or dancing with a female friend and I notice glances examining, studying, trying to dissect my actions. Perhaps it is certain members of the Church that are to blame, placing clergy way too high on pedestals. I firmly believe we Christians need to show respect to their ministers, certainly, they help to lead the Church and they are after all, baptized children of God. We priests are human, fully human, and that's not such a bad thing. St. Paul put it best when he said that we ministers possess treasure in earthen vessels. We have the authority to change bread and wine into Jesus' body and blood, but we still struggle with insecurities. We have fears, dreams, and goals and like anyone we can get cranky when we don't sleep well or haven't eaten because we are too busy to slow down. We forget people's names though we don't intend to forget and every now and then we forget appointments. We enjoy our days off and try and do things that remind us that we are more than just administrators or sacramental dispensing machines. We still find some people attractive, some pleasant, and some others annoying. We don't have all the answers all of the time and unlike Jesus, sometimes we can disappoint people. Jesus this Sunday warns us against a puritan way of thinking where we become prudish, judgmental, or so easily scandalized. True evil and uncleanness, we are told, is bred within the human heart that is petty and objectifies people for what they have. I mention the clerical state because this is just one area where we see how pharisaical we can be. We need to remember that holiness is not always easily spotted, especially when it is appearances only that are considered. I can tell you that I am far from reaching the holiness I seek, but with your prayers and support I will grow in this too, to be a better pastor. Let us not soon forget this important lesson from Our Lord and be less concerned with the superficial. Let us not label one another by the impressions we gather, but deeply discern where God is leading us and others through faith, hope and charity.
