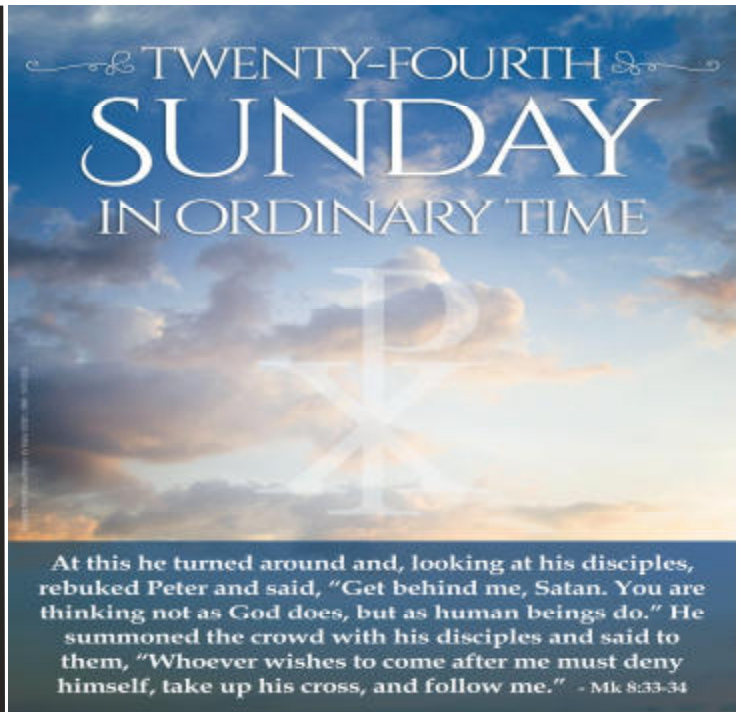

My name is Timothy Davis, and I am the seminarian serving Our Lady of Guadalupe parish for this year. A lot of you have already seen me up at the altar, but I wanted to tell all of you a bit about myself so that we could know each other a bit better.

I'm 29, and was actually born and raised in Illinois, two hours west of Chicago, on a small country farm of five acres. The nearest neighbor down the road was about half a mile away, and I grew up homeschooled, with five brothers and sisters, raising chickens, turkeys, and keeping a large produce garden. Adventures with a circle of close friends, a creek, and a nearby treeline, thoroughly explored with my dog, pretty much guaranteed I had a glorious childhood.

In high school, I studied a program of Church history, and that made me ask questions of what the early Church was like. Mom and Dad raised us Evangelical Protestant, to love Jesus and read the Bible, but I became irresistibly drawn to the Catholic Church and was eventually baptized my sophomore year in college.

I went to school in Santa Fe, at St. John's College, and that's my connection to the Archdiocese of Santa Fe. Immediately after deciding I needed to be a Catholic (I was 17 at the time), I felt the draw towards the priesthood, which at the time I thought was ridiculous - I wasn't even baptized! Why should I want something like that? But our God was patient with me, and slowly moved my heart, so that just before graduation I met with the vocation director of Santa Fe, and the next year entered seminary.

Fast forward six years, and with many bumps and turns along the way, I have completed my third year of theological studies. I officially begin my pastoral year this September, and God willing, return to seminary in the fall of 2019 to finish my final year before priesthood in May of 2020. Through this (very) long process, our good God has moved and encouraged me to love the People of God more and more, and to desire with all my heart to serve you as best I can; if He wills it, as a shepherd, a spiritual father, and a simple parish priest.

### pastor's Corner

Dear family,

In one of those shocking moments of the Gospel, we hear proclaimed today the account of Jesus rebuking Peter for asking that he not be crucified. After making the bold statement about the real identity of Jesus and being pronounced as the first leader of the Church, Peter a few moments later is chastised for his lack of faith. What gives? Seriously, I can't help but ask God: isn't your reaction a bit much. Even if Peter's motivation was to save his own hide, wasn't he also looking after his friend, mentor, brother and lord? Would we speak up if a dear friend told us he may be in danger of losing his life and he was going to expose himself to this danger willingly?

On some level, I believe Jesus saw in Peter's rebuking the ploy of the evil one to tempt him away from what he was to endure. But his message is also clear to the mortal pope standing before him, "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." The issue Jesus is addressing is not that Peter is afraid, but that his thinking does not go beyond the comfort-seeking boundaries that would prevent God's love from being manifested. So many times in our lives we are given the opportunity to grow into holier and more Christ-like people, but out of fear and with no vision it's not unusual to see good people hold themselves back or others back from living our God's dream for their lives. It's a good and normal thing to avoid ourselves and others from being subjected to suffering, but the ultimate goal we are given is union with and glory for God Himself. Everything else in life, including suffering, come second to this goal. How do we think, as God does or as humans do?
