Pastor's Corner

Dear family,

Last week we were encouraged to undergo a recalibration of our faith lives and our whole selves. Jesus placed an unmistakable emphasis on the role of love for God and neighbor that must be part and parcel of our attempt at discipleship. We were reminded that a lack of love can leave even our most sacred religious practices devoid of meaning and substance. In today's Gospel, we hear a similar emphasis placed on authenticity. Jesus contrasts two types of individuals, the scribes and the poor widow. He encourages us to avoid the inauthentic and prideful way the scribes live their vocation. They are after attention, acclaim, and accolades. Focused on the external world, they have become egotistical and vain and their faith has no internal effect. The widow, on the other hand, is also made an example of to His disciples. She is commended by Our Lord from giving "from her poverty." Her tithing is a great act of faith since it comes from her very livelihood. Along with those two small coins went a huge piece of her heart into the temple treasury that day! There was nothing vain about her donation, no large show to impress others, but only a great trust in the Lord to take care of her. What the scribes and rich were able to flaunt so loudly, the widow was able to surpass in her quiet integrity. Do we seek a faith that has authenticity, integrity, and that forces us to admit our poverty before God? Or are we content to use our faith as a social tool or a means to feed our ego? Does the profession in Christ we make cut to deepest parts of our being or does it fail to scratch the surface of our made up skin? Again we are forced to look not just at the "what," but also the "how" and "why" in being disciples of Jesus Christ. Do not be afraid to allow Christ to go deeper friends, because that is the work necessary for our conversion, for our salvation.
