

LYME DISEASE

The summer season is upon us, and now that we can start enjoying the outdoors, we should also be aware that it is also Lyme Disease season. Lyme Disease is an infectious disease that causes joint pain and inflammation, as well as heart and nerve complications. The disease was first recognized in 1975 in Lyme, Connecticut, when a cluster of patients developed a strange type of arthritis. The disease is spread by the bite of deer ticks, and is smaller than common dog ticks. They are found on deer, birds and rodents.

Early Lyme symptoms include fatigue, chills, fever, headache, swollen lymph nodes, muscle and joint pain and a characteristic skin rash. The rash is a red circular patch that appears three days to a month after the bite, and the center may become clear as it enlarges, resulting in a "bullseye" appearance. Lyme disease is often difficult to diagnose because the symptoms mimic other diseases. A new test called PCR (polymerase chain-reaction) can be done to detect the disease in its early stages.

If you spend a lot of time outdoors near woods, you may consider talking to your physician about a new vaccine called LYMERix. It can be given in early spring, and it consists of taking three doses over a one-year period.

Lyme Disease can be avoided by taking the following precautions:

- Wear long sleeved shirts, long pants tucked into socks, and closed shoes in tick infested areas.
- Shower soon after coming indoors (the ticks take several hours to attack).
- Use skin repellents containing DEET.
- If bitten, remove the tick immediately by grasping it as close to the skin as possible with tweezers and tugging gently.

Hunger Doesn't Take a Vacation FOOD DRIVE

During June and July—OLV will be having a food collection to help Catholic Charities feed the homeless during the summer months. Summertime means increased hardship for many needy families in the Archdiocese who rely on school breakfast and lunch programs to feed their children's nutritional needs. Food pantries are hard pressed to provide for these hungry people since many food collection drop off or stop for the summer months. Last summer over 50,000 people turned to the 50 faith based food pantries supported by Catholic Charities (over 40% of these were children).

Prayer

From the Treatise on Prayer by Tertullian, priest, 250AD.

Prayer is the offering in spirit that has done away with the sacrifices of old. *What good do I receive from the multiplicity of your sacrifices?* asks God. *I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams, and I do not want the fat of lambs and the blood of bulls and goats. Who has asked for these from your hands?*

What God has asked for we learn from the Gospel. *The hour will come, he says, when true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth. God is a spirit,* and so he looks for worshipers who are like himself.

We are true worshipers and true priests. We pray in spirit, and so offer in spirit the sacrifice of prayer. Prayer is an offering that belongs to God and is acceptable to him: it is the offering he has asked for, the offering he planned as his own.

We must escort it to the altar of God in a procession of good works to the sound of psalms and hymns. Then it will gain for us all that we ask of God.

Rooted

As Catholics, we are to be rooted within a parish community, where we are obligated to come and be fed on God's Word in Scripture and on Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist at least once a week. The Cancer of Choice

The statistics were low. Back in the mid-1960's, not many groups were admitting the link between tobacco and lung cancer. Tobacco manufacturers denied any correlation to the disease; after all, there was a lot of money to be made. Thirty-five years later and 4 million deaths later, we know that tobacco causes cancer. Today the statistics linking abortion and breast cancer are falsely touted as inconclusive. Again, there is a lot of money to be made – this time in the abortion industry. Joel Brind, Ph.D., President of the Breast Cancer Prevention Institute, concluded a meta-analysis of 33 separate studies encompassing hundreds of thousands of women and found that 27 of those studies show those who terminate pregnancies by abortion run a 30% greater risk of breast cancer. The same studies reveal that American women who had abortions before age 18 or after age 30 were at a more than 100% increased risk.

People generally have no real problem wearing proper clothing when entering places that demand such attire. Would you ever consider attending a formal dinner or a wedding dressed in a tee shirt and shorts, or a tank top and swimming trunks?

How to read Bar Codes

ALWAYS READ THE LABELS ON THE FOODS YOU BUY--NO MATTER WHAT THE FRONT OF THE BOX OR PACKAGE SAYS, TURN IT OVER AND READ THE BACK--CAREFULLY! With all the food and pet products now coming from China, it is best to make sure you read labels at the grocery store and especially Walmart when buying food products.

Many products no longer show where they were made, only give where the distributor is located. It is important to read the bar code to track its origin GREAT WAY TO "BUY USA & CANADA" AND NOT FROM CHINA!! This may be useful to know when grocery shopping it's a concern to you. The whole world is afraid of China-made "black hearted goods". Can you differentiate which one is made in Taiwan or China? If the first 3 digits of the barcode are 690, 691 or 692, the product is MADE IN CHINA. 471 is Made in Taiwan.

This is our right to know, but the government and related departments never educate the public, therefore we have to RESCUE ourselves. Nowadays, Chinese businessmen know that consumers do not prefer products "MADE IN CHINA", so they don't show from which country it is made. However, you may now refer to the barcode - remember if the first 3 digits are:

690-692 then it is **MADE IN CHINA**
00 - 09 ... **USA & CANADA**
30 - 37 ... **FRANCE**
40 - 44 ... **GERMANY**
47 ... **Taiwan** 49 ... **JAPAN** 50 ... **UK**

BUY USA & CANADIAN MADE by watching for "0" at the beginning of the number. We need every boost we can get!

DID YOU KNOW?

The term "bleeding heart," often used in a derogatory sense when applied to image-conscious (read *hypocritical*) liberals, had a very Catholic and Incarnational origin. The term came into use not long after the revelations of our Lord to St. Margaret Mary concerning the wounds inflicted by sinful Catholics on His Sacred Heart. In the revelations given to the Visitation nun in 1675, our Lord opened His bosom and exposed before her eyes the very flesh of His human Heart wrapped in a ring of thorns and oozing droplets of His precious blood. "Behold," He said to the saint, "the Heart that has so loved men." Within Catholic Christendom of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, a "bleeding heart" was a heart consumed with true Christian charity for the poor and sick.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen's Cause Moves Forward

This morning the cause for the beatification of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen has been granted a reprieve from the stalemate it has experienced. The Diocese of Peoria announced "with great joy" that the family of Archbishop Fulton Sheen petitioned the Supreme Court of New York state to allow all his remains to be transferred to Peoria, Ill.

Up to this point both the Peoria diocese and the Archdiocese of New York, where Sheen is entombed in St. Patrick's Cathedral, both laid claim to his remains. The cause for his beatification could not move along until this point was settled. Now it seems decided and settled, thanks to Sheen's living relatives. Mrs. Joan Sheen Cunningham, his oldest living relative, supported by other living relatives of the beloved Archbishop Sheen, filed the necessary paperwork to carry out the transfer. The transfer can be carried out as soon as the court grants approval.

Bishop Daniel Jenky of Peoria is immensely grateful for the collaboration of Mrs. Sheen Cunningham and the family. When Bishop Sheen's body is transferred, Bishop Jenky can resume the cause for his beatification, which he surely will do post haste.

The thought is that Sheen's beatification could happen shortly after his remains reach Peoria with, of course, the approval of Pope Francis. Peoria also reports that the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints at the Vatican "has no objection to the transfer and looks forward to the resumption of the Cause. The Congregation has repeatedly expressed their appreciation for the efforts of the Diocese of Peoria over the last 14 years for promoting this Cause."

Msgr. James Kruse, the vicar general of the Peoria diocese, said he's "confident that the Archdiocese of New York will cooperate fully with the request of the family of Archbishop Sheen. On several occasions the archdiocese has declared its desire to cooperate with the wishes of the family. I cannot imagine that the archdiocese will oppose the family's petition presented to the Court. It is our hope that the archdiocese will offer their consent to this petition in order to expedite matters."

Amen! With heaven's help, we can have an officially proclaimed Blessed Fulton Sheen, one of the greatest communications of the Faith and evangelists in the Church in the 20th century, in very short order.

New Research Shows Effectiveness of Natural Family Planning

German scientists are now confirming what many Catholic couples have known for some time - the natural family planning method known as STM works. Scientists have been taken aback by a new study which found STM to be as effective, if not more so, than the contraceptive pill in family planning.

For years married Catholics have used the natural family planning method known as the symptom-thermal method (STM) as a morally licit means to maintain the sexual part of their conjugal relationship while at the same time decreasing the chances of having additional children due to "physical, economic, psychological, or social conditions."

The Catholic Church teaches that natural family methods can be used in a moral manner if the couple remains open to the blessing of children - something which the Church sees as essential to the vocation of marriage.

Charitable Records Set

For the 17th year, Knights' charitable giving and volunteer hours grow . The Knights of Columbus set a new all-time record last year for charitable donations and service hours with \$175,079,192 in donations and more than 73.5 million hours of service. The numbers were announced at the closing session of the annual Organizational Meeting of State Deputies in New Haven.

"We are very proud of these Fraternal Survey numbers," Supreme Knight Anderson said. "These are a clear indication that we are keeping faith with Father McGivney's principle of charity and also of unity, not only among ourselves, but with those in need. This is what we call a charity that evangelizes. This is what makes Knights of Columbus different."

Supreme Knight Anderson went on to say that these records of giving perfectly illustrate the point made by Father Tomasz Kraj, Poland Associate State Chaplain and Theologian in Residence at the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, in his homily during the Mass that preceded the closing session. Father Kraj said that the world needs more men who pay witness through their actions to what it means to be a Catholic.

"We are answering Pope Francis' call to go to the peripheries," the supreme knight said. "We can reach half way around the globe to help those in need and we can reach to our neighbor next door. And we do that every day. That makes us witnesses to the faith."

The number of service hours rose by more than a million over the previous year's total, according to the Knights of Columbus Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for the year ending Dec. 31, 2015. Donations grew by more than \$1.5 million since 2014, achieving an increase in giving for the 17th consecutive year.

TRUE DANGER

In view of the corrupt system outlined above, when people ask about the sex abuse crisis, "How could this have happened?" the only answer is, "How could it not have happened?" when whistle-blowers were punished and abusers honored or at least coddled. The only response is "Thank God it happened!" Not thank God children were abused, but thank God the corrupt system that allowed it to continue was blown sky high. It is only the beginning, but it may well be the deliverance for which so many of us have been praying.

Recalling the famous vision of Pope Leo XIII where he saw God grant Satan's request of 100 years to destroy the Church, and chose the 20th century, was it an accident that this particular stronghold collapsed two years into the 21st century? Judgment begins with the House of God (1 Peter 4:17). Thank God. What does this all have to do with contraception? Contraception was the epicenter of the "sexual revolution." Contraception was also the epicenter of the movement for dissent against Church teaching, Humanae Vitae in particular, and the center of most of the fiercest battles in the Church today. Contraception, abortion and homosexuality are the three legs of the stool upon which the Culture of Death sits.

Would the response of the most important be jobs or career, the pursuit of money and material wealth, or themselves over the correct answer of family?
