New Hope Resource Center News

Our recent fundraiser concert was a huge success. Thanks to all of you that participated in the auction, raffle, and bake sale, and thanks for donating to the offering. We made \$5,248 this year – an all time high! These funds help us during the year to supplement our service budget.

During the previous fiscal year which ended on June 30th, New Hope provided emergency assistance and chore service 4,625 times. We loaned instruments to five students and distributed winter coats to 298 people with the help of the Knights. New Hope built Easter baskets for 76 children and helped with meals and gifts during Thanksgiving and Christmas for 100 families through the Riverside and Mead School Districts.

Our school supply distribution assisted 153 students. With your help, we were able to provide Christmas gifts to 172 children and host a Christmas party here at St. Joseph for 237 people.

Your monetary gifts help us to provide for clients through the year. We are blessed to have many St Joseph parishioners donate countless hours serving as volunteers in our office and clothing bank, helping during the Christmas party, working at the North County Food Pantry, and in the community garden. We are grateful to the Knights for their Coats for Kids drive and for providing food truck assistance at the pantry.
