**THOUGHTS FROM FR. RICHARD  
 PENSAMIENTOS DE PADRE RICARDO**

**■ FIND THE MERCY YOU NEED THIS YEAR**

This Tuesday, December 8, Pope Francis opens the Holy Year Door in the Basilica of St. Peter's in Rome. Following the Jewish custom which celebrated a Holy Year of Jubilee every 50 years, the Catholic Church began to do the same. This custom was inaugurated by Pope Boniface VIII in the year 1300.

For the Jewish people it was a way to begin everything in society all over again, like a new moment in creation. All debts were forgiven. All property was returned to its first owner. All loans were cancelled. All slaves were set free. All sins were forgiven. The Catholic Church has never been quite that merciful in its celebrations, which focused more on gaining indulgences, participating in the Sacraments, going to Confession and reducing time to be spent in purgatory. Practicing the Spiritual and Corporal works of mercy were also promoted.

Pope Francis has called for a Holy Year of Mercy, that is to have God's Mercy at its center. The Pope wants us to "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. ( Luke 6: 36)." The mercy of God is a great mystery. The Pope invites each one of us to discover the gift once again for ourselves, and pass the gift of awareness along to others.

St. Bonaventure Church will have its own Holy Year Door. As we walk through and walk out the door may we realize that we are walking into something grand and helpful; and when we leave, may we realize that we are bringing more to the world and those in it on the outside, the very mercy of God.

There are two approaches to God's Mercy: either that we have to earn it or just receive it. There have always been two schools of spiritual thinking about this. The first way of thinking believes that God came into the world to redeem us because we are sinful. Once redeemed, we should perform differently, showing our gratitude. The other way believes that God came into the world to love mercy

and grace into us, to fill all of creation with his presence. All is grace. We do not have to earn our way. God is there to help us when we fail, which may be often or not. Mercy holds everything together. That should be the motivation of our lives. This kind of God of love does not have to give us "Indulgences" to release our time in Purgatory. We should be so grateful to be loved by God as to want to love God fully in return.

This, I believe, is the God of Pope Francis, and it is certainly my God. I fact, I believe that Pope Francis is doing all he can to help us understand and to embrace this understanding and experience of God. That is why he convoked the "Year of Mercy."

The year is not only for us as individuals to receive from God. The Pope wants us to be missionaries of God's mercy to others, especially those who live outside the church and society, and those who are deemed lost because they do not fit in. The Pope is asking us to bridge distances, to embrace human life and to touch the suffering flesh of Christ in others.

"I am thinking of those burdened by sufferings, injustice and tyranny; of those enslaved to money, to power, to success, worldliness. We are all called to comfort our brothers and sisters, to testify that God alone can eliminate the causes of existential and spiritual tragedies."

So we shall be doing many things to reach out to various groups of people, from divorced and remarried, to gay persons who feel rejected by the church. Often church representatives and church procedures are obstacles to many Catholics. In this Year of Mercy, we will try to remove as many obstacles to God's love and to full communion with the Church as possible. If Fr. David and I can be of help to you or to anyone, please let us know.

Two years ago, Pope Francis wrote in "The Joy of the Gospel": "I invite all Christians to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ, or at least an openness to letting him encounter them." He extends this invitation again in this Year of Mercy. No one is excluded

from the mercy and joy brought by Jesus. Encourage one another and encourage those you know who need God's mercy to find it this year.

**PROCEDURE FOR DISPLAYING EVENTS IN CHURCH FOYER**

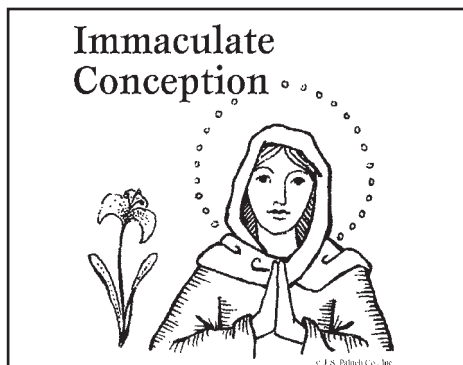
We’ve noticed in recent months many things being left in the foyer for people to pick-up. Many times, we don’t know who left them and/or anything about the organization or event. It also makes the table by the entrance to the church look crowded and messy. In an effort to manage the display of these promotional materials, we are instituting a procedure for displaying these items in the church foyer:

- As a rule, unless something is being sponsored by the parish, diocese or USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops), we do not allow flyers in the foyer.
- For all material meeting the above rule, the flyer originals must be stamped for approval by the parish office. After being stamped, they may be copied.
- Flyers are not to be placed on the table by the entrance to the church. There are slots in the Plexiglas notice wall by the door to the hospitality room.

LITURGY & PRAYER

**JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY**  
**December 6, 2015, Second Sunday**  
**of Advent**

This Tuesday, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Francis will open the “Holy Door” in Saint Peter’s Basilica, symbolically opening the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*. In today’s scriptures, Baruch confidently anticipates God’s healing of the brokenness of humanity, and Paul sees God bringing our discernment, knowledge, and love to fulfillment. Our experience of life and of ourselves can make such prophecies seem wildly optimistic, even hopelessly naïve. Pope Francis challenges us to live this Jubilee Year as a graced time, when God’s mercy reawakens our enthusiasm to live our baptismal call as gospel people, our hope renewed and ourselves recommitted to selfless charity. Notice that in Luke’s Gospel today, God bypasses the religious elite and politically powerful to speak to a humble believer in the barren desert the saving word that will transform history. So God’s mercy continues to accomplish humanity’s salvation *in and through* ordinary, flawed, and least likely instruments—even us.

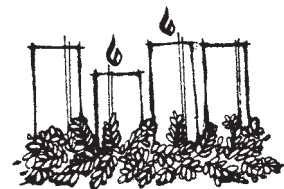
**NEED A NEIGHBOR?**

We could not have done this without you, and we thank everyone who helped us surpass our original goal of \$10,000. To date, we have recorded nine songs in the church with piano only and have four songs to go. There is still a lot more work to do, and I regret to inform you that the CD will not be ready before the end of the year. I was hoping that we could accomplish this by Christmas, but with the holiday season fast approaching, it just isn’t possible given the scheduling conflicts in recording instrumentalists and soloists separately in the studio. Rest assured the new CD is coming, and we will keep you informed. For all those who purchased a pre-sale CD expecting to give it as a Christmas present, I am sorry that this is not possible. 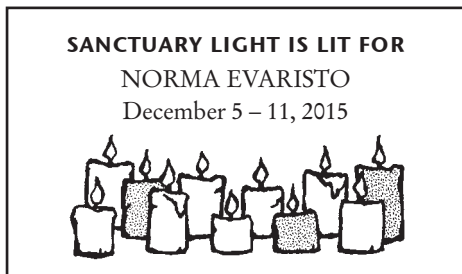

■ **LUCAS 3:1-6**  
**ADVIENTO UN LLAMADO A LA MISERICORDIA**

Misericordia significa ir a la ayuda de otro con un sentido de relación. Adviento significa “próximo” o “llegada”; así que el enfoque de la temporada de Adviento es esperar. Si juntamos Misericordia y Adviento, tendremos que estamos esperando que todas las personas y las naciones en la tierra estén en una relación en la que se fomente la ayuda mutua en vez de la competencia y el conflicto. ¡Así se establecerá el Reino! Esta es una espera activa. “Tenemos Misericordia” unos a otros trabajando para generarla.

Este Adviento, nos preparamos una vez más para la venida de Cristo y la Navidad, nos permite prepararnos también a la venida de todos aquellos que están en busca de la misericordia y del pueblo santo de Dios. Hagamos que todas las puertas estén abiertas para ellos en el Año de la Misericordia. En las palabras del Papa Francisco: “en este Año Jubilar, dejemos que Dios nos sorprenda. Él nunca deja de abrir las puertas de su corazón y de repetir que nos ama y quiere compartir su amor con nosotros.”

**11/29 Primer domingo de Adviento: Misericordia es Esperanza:** Vigilantes esperando el Día del Señor. Las escrituras de este Adviento abren con Jeremías proclamando la promesa de Dios de justicia y seguridad para personas oprimidas y cansadas de la guerra. Pablo pide a los cristianos aumentar y abundar en el amor para todos. Finalmente, después de nombrar terribles cataclismos naturales, (podríamos añadir el terrorismo humano), Jesús nos invita a evitar desvíos egocéntricos y ansiedades de auto consumo. En cambio, debemos anticipar con confianza y misericordia la venida de Jesús, asistiendo devotamente a aquellos que necesitan de la misericordia de Dios y nuestro cuidado.

**Preguntas de reflexión de la semana: en la preparación para el inicio de la próxima semana del Año Jubilar de la Misericordia, considerar: ¿cómo la misericordia de Dios ha tocado mi vida? ¿Cómo puedo ser un instrumento de la misericordia de Dios a otros en este Año jubilar?**

**12/6 Segundo domingo de Adviento: Misericordia es Aceptar:** Viene la restauración. El esplendor de la misericordia de Dios, viene, restaurando la paz con justicia y unidos para la adoración. Pablo afirma con confianza, que Dios continuará cumpliendo esas promesas al aumentar el amor de los creyentes y afilando su discernimiento de los valores. Pasamos el Adviento, preparándonos para la venida del Señor y esto es apropiado. Pero la llegada es más que una temporada de cuatro-Domingos; es todo un camino de vida. Nuestra vida bautismal se caracteriza por la constante preparación para el cambio seguro que trae cada venida de Cristo.

**Preguntas de reflexión de la semana: Como el año del Jubileo de la Misericordia comienza, con giros y vueltas ¿Qué es necesario que Dios desenrede en mi vida? ¿Qué aristas suavizar? ¿Qué Montañas de orgullo podar? ¿Valles de indiferencia y descuido llenar de misericordia para otros?**

**12/13 Tercer domingo de Adviento: Misericordia es Regocijo:** el Santo de Israel está entre nosotros. ¡Juan el Bautista proclama! “Uno más poderoso que yo viene... Él os bautizará con Espíritu Santo y con fuego... El trigo que se reunirá en su granero y la paja quemará con fuego inextinguible” (Lucas 3:16, 17). ¿Qué es una “Buena noticia”? ¿”Regocijo” en el domingo? ¡Sí! El habló para tres grupos claramente diferentes: multitudes devotas, pecadores publicanos y soldados verdaderamente despreciados — preguntan, “¿Qué debo hacer,” la respuesta de Juan es que no hay ninguna necesidad de cambio donde la vida les ha puesto, sólo en lo que la vida les ha dado. Lo mismo para nosotros: estamos donde estamos, pero convertidos en lo que Dios espera que seamos. Juan exhorta a la multitud a compartir ropa y alimentos; recaudadores de impuestos a la justicia práctica, con integridad profesional y personal; soldados a ser honestos y respetuosos. ¡Nos podría decir Juan, todo lo anterior! En otras palabras, ser caritativos, generosos. Practicar el Evangelio traduce el Año jubilar de la Misericordia en testimonio

vivido. Juan incluso se sorprendió cuando el Mesías previsto llegó, no con manos juzgadoras, sino con manos de sanación, compasión y perdón-- Misericordia.

**Preguntas de reflexión de la semana: ¿qué me alegra? ¿Cuándo he estado feliz recientemente? ¿Cómo expresar esa alegría a los demás? ¿Cómo puedo yo contagiarla?**

**12/20 Cuarto domingo de Adviento: Misericordia es expresar:** teniendo a Cristo vivo dentro de nosotros. El Evangelio de la Visitación cuenta que Juan el Bautista salta de alegría en el vientre de Elizabeth. David saltó y bailó delante del arca llevando preciosas muestras de la presencia permanente de Dios (tablas de la ley, vara de Aarón, Maná celestial), así que Juan saltó cuando llega María, con Jesús — encarnado cumpliendo la ley, pastor verdadero de la humanidad, Pan vivo del cielo. Sin embargo este regocijo también nace del auto sacrificio. Cómo deben haber sido las preocupaciones de María, como madre soltera joven, cuyo embarazo causó a José, hombre justo, tal angustia. Todavía al instante, sin egoísmo, María trasciende a sí misma, corriendo a pesar de su peligrosa condición sobre terreno peligroso, para ayudar a una pariente mayor. En la proclamación del Año de la Misericordia que acaba de empezar, el Papa Francisco exclamó cuánto deseaba este año de Jubileo estar lleno de misericordia, para que podamos salir a todo el mundo, llevando el bálsamo de la misericordia de Dios tanto a los creyentes y a los lejos de la fe, señalando que el Reino de Dios ya está presente entre nosotros. Porque por el bautismo y la Eucaristía, como María, tenemos el Cristo viviente dentro de nosotros, salir para servir a los demás en el amor abnegado es nuestro mejor regalo de Navidad a todos.
