**■ THE PAUSING THAT MAKES THE
 DIFFERENCE**

The next feast of the Christmas Season is today's Holy Family, a reminder that it is also a place for the Incarnation of God to live. We see the Incarnation of God more when we are on our best behavior than when we are on our worst.

Fostering good wholesome family life is a goal and a challenge. Controlling stress and making adequate time to cultivate endearing relationships are key. What is all the purpose of working so hard to achieve a certain style of life if there is coldness, anger and negativity all around?

Parents: Don't forget to bless your children before you send them off to school. Don't forget to gather your children to talk, to share about their daily life and experiences. Don't sign your children up for everything. They need "to be" more than they need "to do." Savor the Holiday time to be together and to do things together. Things and activities do not substitute for the "Spirit of the Family."

The Holy Family is pictured as a three-some, genuinely human and wholesome, we imagine. Their times were much more simple than ours and so were their challenges. With fewer distractions and opportunities, and with more cultural expectations and ideals about how to relate to one another, they probably were much more close-knit.

The point is not them, but how we do family today in the best sense of the word. Be creative. Be inventive and do not leave God and the spiritual life out of the picture. There is something wrong with the picture when sports and activities replace Sunday morning Mass. That is where the spiritual life and the spiritual instinct is developed.

Pray Psalm 46: "Come think of God's marvels, the astounding things he has done in the world," verse 8, and "Pause awhile and know that I am God," verse 10. It's the "pausing" that makes all the difference in our personal and family lives.

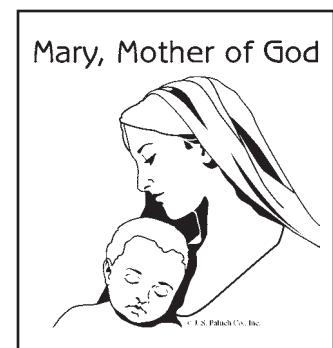

We Offer:

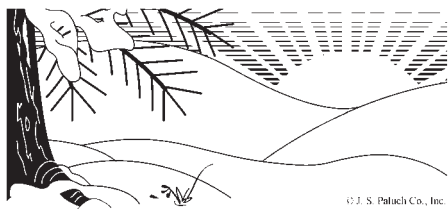
- Assistance with transportation to the parish, the grocery store or doctor. *We can assist in finding regular rides to a specific Mass or parish offering

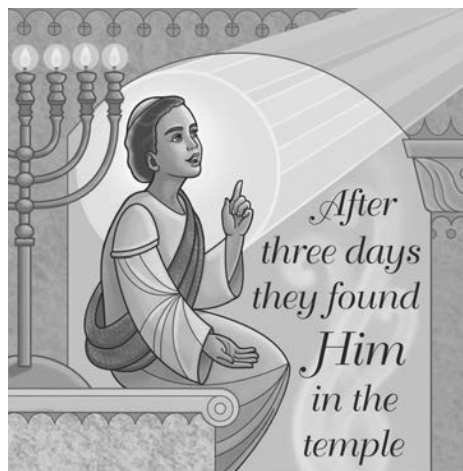

■ LLUCAS 2, 41-52

Solían ir cada año a Jerusalén por las fiestas de Pascua. En primer lugar, en las lecturas de hoy lo que sobresale es esa relación íntima entre Dios y familia; familia y Dios. ¿Qué otra cosa es el Evangelio sino la encarnación de Dios en una familia y la trascendencia de esa familia; María, José el niño, trascendiendo hacia Dios? Ya dijimos hacia donde nos presenta caminando a la familia de Nazaret, hacia el templo, el centro nacional religioso de Israel. Todas las pascuas eran fiestas religiosas-nacionales para los judíos y esta buena familia de los israelitas como todas las familias, va año con año, como nuestras familias de los campos a celebrar las fiestas patronales. Es el signo de que camina la familia hacia Dios.

¿Qué hermoso es ver, viniendo a la Misa dominical, a las familias! Ojalá el espectáculo del Evangelio de hoy se repitiera en nuestras ciudades y en nuestros campos. Las familias buscando a Dios.

Se acentúa el carácter sagrado de la familia.= Obediencia al Padre. Hay un diálogo entre Jesús y sus padres, para decirles que por encima del padre y de la madre de la tierra, hay un Padre de los cielos, cuya voluntad tiene que hacer todo miembro de familia. El joven no tiene que ser manipulado ni por su papá ni por su mamá, cuando se trata de voluntad del Padre que está en los cielos. “Hijo-le dice la Virgen a Jesús-, ¿Por qué lo has hecho así?” Y Jesús, con toda la ternura de un hijo, pero también con la valentía de un hijo de Dios, le dice: “¿Por qué me buscabais?, ¿No sabes que debía de ocuparme de las cosas de mi Padre?” Todo hombre tiene que decir esta realidad. Si es cierto que hay un amor muy grande entre los esposos, amor hasta la muerte, santificado por Dios, debe estar siempre subordinado al querer de Dios. La ley de Dios por encima de todo.

Cristo es el ejemplo de la familia orientada hacia Dios. La obediencia al Padre. “¿Para qué me quiere Dios?” Es importante saber discernir por encima de todos los considerandos económicos y familiares: “¿para qué me quiere Dios?”

Cuántas veces se oye decir: “Yo quisiera ser sacerdote pero soy muy pobre.” No importa, buscad el Reino de Dios y su justicia, obediencia a vuestra vocación y todo lo demás vendrá por añadidura: ¿Qué no somos pobres la mayoría de los que somos sacerdotes? ¿Qué no sentimos en los labios de nuestra madre el lamento: cómo quisiera darte gusto pero no puedo, soy pobre? Y aquí estamos de sacerdotes muchos que encontramos esa dificultad pero que gracias a Dios, siguiendo la voluntad del Señor, se presentaron los medios. Dios quiere las cosas y muchas veces somete a prueba nuestras mismas facultades.

Y, luego, cuando regresan en aquel hogar de Nazaret, donde Pablo VI un día, recién elegido Pontífice, fue a visitar Tierra Santa y allí en la casa de Nazaret-donde hoy se levanta una hermosa Iglesia-decía: “¿Quién pudiera vivir con aquella compañía santa de la familia de Nazaret y aprender aquí la sencillez de la vida, el silencio, el trabajo, la oración.” Quien pudiera, queridos jóvenes, queridos hermanos, que nuestra casa, por humilde que sea fuera de verdad la casa de Nazaret. Y allí, la primera lectura de hoy nos ofrece esos deberes rutinarios de familia pero convertidos en un culto a Dios.

Dios es familia. (Juan Pablo II). Me gusta en este momento recordarles la hermosa frase del Papa Juan Pablo II hablando de la familia en México. La familia y su relación con Dios, lo más profundo que se puede decir es esto: “Se ha dicho en forma bella y profunda que nuestro Dios en su misterio más íntimo no es una soledad, sino una familia, puesto que lleva en sí mismo paternidad, filiación y la esencia de la familia que es el amor. Este amor en la familia divina, es el Espíritu Santo.” El tema de la familia, pues, no es ajeno al tema del Espíritu Santo. Es preciso saber que Dios es familia. Que en Dios hay Padre, Hijo y lo que une esa relación, el amor que se hace persona, el Espíritu Santo, como la unción, el lazo que une esas relaciones de familia.

Por eso, en la tierra, cuando Dios dijo: “hagamos el hombre a nuestra imagen y semejanza,” lo hizo hombre y mujer, para que amándose en matrimonio procediera

la fecundidad de la familia y todo lo ungiera el amor, el Espíritu de Dios.
