THOUGHTS FROM FR. RICHARD
 PENSAMIENTOS DE PADRE RICARDO

■ MY PARISH MINISTRY BEGAN WITH
 “OVER MY DEAD BODY”

I relished the moment – my 50th Anniversary Mass of Ordination on May 17. The Resurrection Choir had worked for several months preparing the music chosen for the liturgy. My cousin, William Cardinal Levada, had chosen the scriptures. I wanted to mark the anniversary on the same day and evening of the first ordination fifty years ago. I wanted to honor the day by inviting fellow priests of the Diocese of Oakland to come together in a moment of thanksgiving and solidarity, as we are all priests serving in the Diocese of Oakland together.

Over the last few weeks I have had many thoughts and reflections about my ministry as a priest over the last 50 years. I have been sharing with them that I would describe my first 10 years as “over my dead body” years. I came out of the seminary just as the Second Vatican Council was ending, and our generation of newly ordained priests were introducing liturgical changes. Something as simple as having guitars at Mass caused upheavals for a pastor 40 years older than me. Writing Prayers of the Faithful in personal ways was an upheaval.

My first parish assignment was the ‘Church of the Assumption’ in San Leandro. About six months after being there, the teenagers wanted to introduce more youth-friendly music at the 9:00am Sunday Mass, with guitars and other instruments. There was no way to bring the subject up with the older pastor, because he said “over my dead body” to most proposals.

So we decided to just do it, and see where “the chips would fall.” On the Sunday we decided on, after the parking lot cleared from the early Mass, several cars with teenagers drove up with cars loaded – people and instruments. I should have warned them not to park right in the middle of the parking lot facing the pastor’s second floor living room

window. As the teenagers began opening and closing doors, the pastor watched, immediately tore down the stairs, having a conniption fit - - but the Mass happened, and the guitars remained after the pastor received positive and favorable comments – “over my dead body.” It would not be the last time I would hear that phrase.

As I have been invited to come to various parish groups in the weeks that precede my retirement, at some point various parishioners and co-workers share about what has affected them by my ministry. So many of you have expressed your gratitude as we connected in the moment of sickness, dying, funeral planning, celebrations of funerals and burials. As I stop to think about that, I recognize that experiences have brought many of us together as friends in the most profound experience of life.

That touching point where the priest and the funeral coordinator meet a family and begin a very important journey together has become a touchstone of my ministry at St. Bonaventure, and has drawn me to families and friends of families. I recognize this moment as a most profound moment

because not only has God prepared me for that ministry, but has brought it to a perfection, and perhaps it has become one of the signature moments in my ministry.

So many people, when they ask me or hear that I am on my way to a funeral, often reply with “I am sorry to hear that.” I respond with, “Oh, don’t be sorry, it will be a wonderful moment.” because families are gathering to close the pages of a life and helping to open the other. I enjoy meeting the families and escorting them through a very privileged moment.

I have always put the needs of the people in the parishes first where I have been, before the needs of the church as an institution that safeguards some ideal truth codified in theology. Guidelines and procedures are necessary for large worldwide institutions, but spiritual discernment, the spiritual needs of people, meeting people where they are, and encountering one another as children of God who need an ear, are much more important than anything else. That is what Pope Francis means when he talks about “Encounter and Solidarity.”

■ IT TAKES A COMMUNITY

We all know the adage that it takes a village. True for many things. But how do *you* describe a village in our western society? I describe it as community. And I describe community as a group of people who support and care for each other.

Have you noticed that the signage at the entrance to our property reads “St. Bonaventure Catholic Community”, and so does our web site? This is not an accident. It is an intentional expression of who we see ourselves to be.

It takes a community to pass on faith, to support each other in our faith journeys, to comfort each other in pain and celebrate joys. That is what St. Bonaventure Catholic Community does. These are not just words. These are prayers and actions—and gifts of time, talent and treasure.

Every quarter we report on the financial picture of our community, because our ability to live out our mission is tied to our financial health. Modern church has expenses like any other organization.

This year we are experiencing a decline in financial stewardship. We are currently \$20,000 below where we were last year at this time, and the April donations indicate a continuation of that trend. Easter had the lowest collection in six years.

If we are going to continue to Know Christ Better and Make Him Better Known, if we are going to welcome a new priest without cutting other services or support, it will take the whole community to make this happen. **If you aren't donating regularly, please start. 

Dear Fellow St. Bonaventure parishioners: Our refugee family—Dad Najib, Mom Zainab, and children Faisal, Marwa and Bilal—are hoping to move to Concord before their lease expires on June 14th. They have had many challenges living in Bay Point. This lovely family has faced discrimination, the children have been bullied both at home and at school, Zainab feels unsafe walking Marwa to and from school, and Najib works long hours requiring him to walk home from BART in the middle of the night. Their home has been egged, a knife was pulled on Faisal, and there have been shootings at their apartment complex. While the family remains very thankful for all the opportunities they have been given, now that Najib is working, they would like to move to a safer location.

Here's how you can help:

Do you know of someone who has an affordable apartment or home that they would be willing to rent to the Ahmadis? Because Najib is the sole breadwinner, affordable rent would be a tremendous help! The family would love to live close to our St. Bonaventure community or in the Monument Corridor, near their friend who lives at Monument and Meadow Lane. They would like to find an apartment or house with a minimum of 2BR/2BA, a washer and dryer, and room for a dining table. We are hoping to help them find a home in a safe location that is close to schools.

■ MI MINISTERIO PARROQUIAL SE INICIÓ “SOBRE MI CADÁVER”

Disfrute el momento- mi 50 aniversario de ordenación el 17 de mayo lo celebre con una misa. El coro De Resurrección trabajo durante varios meses preparando la música, elegida para la liturgia. Mi primo, Cardenal William Levada escogió las escrituras. Yo quería marcar el aniversario en el mismo día y la noche de la primera ordenación hace cincuenta años. Quería honrar el día invitando a mis compañeros sacerdotes de la Diócesis de Oakland a unirse en un momento de acción de gracias y solidaridad como somos todos los sacerdotes que sirven en la Diócesis de Oakland.

Durante las últimas semanas he tenido muchos pensamientos y reflexiones acerca de mi ministerio como sacerdote en mis 50 años. He estado compartiendo con ellos que describiría mis primeros 10 años como “sobre mi cadáver.” Salí del seminario al igual que el Concilio Vaticano II llegaba a su fin, y nuestra generación de sacerdotes recién ordenados estaban introduciendo cambios litúrgicos. Algo tan simple como tener guitarras en la misa causo trastornos para un pastor de 40 años más que yo. Escribir oraciones de los fieles de manera personal fue una conmoción.

Mi primera asignación fue a la Iglesia de la asunción en san Leandro. Unos seis meses después de estar allí, los adolescentes querían introducir música acogedora para los jóvenes en la misa del domingo a las 9:00am con guitarras y otros instrumentos. No había manera de tocar el tema con el pastor mayor, porque dijo “sobre mi cadáver” para la mayoría de las propuestas.

Así que decidimos hacerlo y ver donde “caerían las fichas” En el domingo que se decidió después que el estacionamiento quedo vacío de la misa temprano, varios coches con adolescentes aparecieron cargados de gente e instrumentos. Debería haberles advertido que no se estacionaran en medio de la zona de parqueo frente a la ventana del Pastor en la sala del segundo piso. A medida que los adolescentes comenzaron a abrir y cerrar puertas, el pastor los vio e inmediatamente bajo por las escaleras con un aspecto de enojo— pero la misa se llevó a cabo después el

pastor recibió comentarios positivos y favorables— “sobre mi cadáver” No sería la última vez que yo escuchara esa frase.

Me han invitado a venir a diversos grupos parroquiales en las semanas que preceden a mi retiro, en algún momento, varios feligreses y compañeros de trabajo comparten sobre lo que les ha afectado mi ministerio. Así que muchos de ustedes han expresado su agradecimiento a medida que conectamos en el momento de una enfermedad, la muerte, la planificación del funeral, celebraciones de funerales y entierros. Yo me pongo a pensar en eso, reconozco que las experiencias nos han llevado juntos a muchos de nosotros como amigos en la más profunda experiencia de la vida.

Ese punto donde el sacerdote y el coordinador del funeral se reúnen con la familia y comienzan juntos un viaje muy importante se ha convertido en una piedra conmovedora de mi ministerio en San Buenaventura y me han acercado a las familias y amigos de las familias. Reconozco este momento como un momento muy profundo en el cual Dios me había preparado para este ministerio, pero lo he llevado a una perfección, y tal vez, uno de los momentos más significantes en mi ministerio.

Así que mucha gente cuando me preguntan o escuchan que voy en camino a un funeral, a menudo responden con

“Lamento escuchar es.” Yo respondo con, “Oh, no lo sientas, será un momento maravilloso para que las familias se reúnen a cerrar las páginas de una vida y ayudar a abrir la otra. Me gusta conocer a las familias y acompañarlas a través de un momento muy privilegiado.

Siempre he puesto primero las necesidades de las personas en las parroquias donde he estado antes que las necesidades de la iglesia como una situación en que las proteja de algo, de la verdad de los ideales codificado en teología. Pautas y procedimientos son necesarios para la grandes instituciones do todo el mundo, pero el discernimiento espiritual, las necesidades espirituales de la gente, de la reunión donde se encuentran, y encontrarse unos a otros como hijos de Dios que necesitan un oído son mucho más importantes que cualquier otra cosa. Esto es lo que significa cuando El Papa Francisco habla de “encuentro y Solidaridad.”



■ **SE NECESITA TODA UNA COMUNIDAD**

Todos sabemos el adagio que toma un pueblo. Es cierto para muchas cosas. Pero, ¿cómo describen una aldea en nuestra sociedad occidental? Lo describo como comunidad. Y describo a la comunidad como un grupo de personas que se apoyan y se cuidan el uno al otro. ¿Ha notado que el rótulo en la entrada de nuestra propiedad dice.
