■ HOPE TO EXPERIENCE YOUR PERSONAL PENTECOST

Have you ever had the experience or the feeling that you dreamed about doing something or actually did it, lived through it, and when it was over wondered about how you did it? Well, that is one of my reflections, having recently celebrated my Golden Jubilee as a priest.

As we all do, we live out our vocations, whether for marriage, family or careers, in small segments of days, hours and events. I have never been a person who has counted or kept track of how many of this or that I have done, although people have asked if I remember how many funerals, weddings or baptisms that I have done. I have been very active and very involved in all aspects of parish life and in the Diocese of Oakland. I have experienced an accomplished priesthood, trying to be the best minister that I could have been at any occasion and having done the best that I could to have presented the Catholic Church at its very best.

Today is the Solemnity of Pentecost, and I have sought to be in the Holy Spirit when I minister. I know when that is. I have this experience as I prepare my Sunday homily. I read and ponder the texts. I study to exegete the passages, that is to try to understand their meaning at the time of their writing. Then I sit and wait. What God do you want to say, I pray? I have found that going to something totally unrelated to the studying of the scriptures helps. It could be picking up things around my apartment or arranging flowers, etc. When I return to sit down and pick up a pen, I say “Okay Holy Spirit” and then the Holy Spirit writes.

Many years ago, as a young priest, I made fun of a classic painting showing one of the evangelists writing his gospel with the

Holy Spirit whispering in his ear what to write. I have always remembered that painting, and think of those agnostic days, only now to rely upon the Holy Spirit whispering in my ear.

I can also experience that spiritual freedom as I celebrate the liturgy, the Mass. I believe that I celebrate the Mass in a spirit-filled way. I remember one of my seminary professors giving us a retreat reflecting on the spirituality of the priest. In those days, when Latin was used in the liturgy always, there was the Psalm 42 that began “Ad Deum qui laetificat juventutem meum.” ‘I will go to the altar of God who brings joy to my youth.’

The priest professor hoped and prayed that we would always celebrate the liturgy with youthful joy. That would be hard to do in Latin, but by the time I began to celebrate the Mass, there was no Latin.

Nevertheless, I endeavor to celebrate now just as I did 50 years ago, with faith, with fervor, with enthusiasm, with joy.

I believe that the form of the liturgy is a guiding form, that the phrases, translated from Latin, often are not in vernacular English. They are guidelines. While they may be centuries old, they are derived from a spirituality that is centuries old and preoccupied with eternal salvation. They make very little mention of the help that we need on earth to live and serve well here. People mention often that they like my down-to-earth and friendly approach to celebrating the Eucharist. Newly ordained priests are often very structured or stiff in their celebration of Mass, focusing more on rubrics, as they were taught. It takes a while to grow into celebrating the Eucharist, to feel the prayers, to celebrate in the Spirit.

I remember this seminary teacher who once encouraged me to pray the liturgy joyfully and not mechanically, and who was also the same philosophy teacher who said that we should not be studying

philosophy until we were 50, because we did not have enough experience in life. I think that the same thing can be said about spirituality.

It is one thing to learn some doctrine, devotions and prayers. It is another thing to mature, to experience life, to find God in a personal way, to be drawn to religion, a word which means to find your bond with God.

“On that day you will realize,’ Jesus said, ‘that I am in my Father and you are in me and I am in you.’ (John 14) That is Pentecost, a personal Pentecost for each one of us. Perhaps, you experienced once a long time ago. Pray (desire) to experience it again!

They have had many challenges living in Bay Point. This lovely family has faced discrimination, the children have been bullied both at home and at school, Zainab feels unsafe walking Marwa to and from school, and Najib works long hours requiring him to walk home from BART in the middle of the night. Their home has been egged, a knife was pulled on Faisal, and there have been shootings at their apartment complex. While the family remains very thankful for all the opportunities they have been given, now that Najib is working, they would like to move to a safer location.



■ DESEO, ESPERANZA PARA SU EXPERIENCIA PERSONAL PENTECOSTES

¿Ha tenido la experiencia o la sensación de que soñaba con hacer algo o realmente lo hizo, vivió a través de él, y cada vez más se preguntó acerca de ¿cómo lo hice?

Bueno, esa es una de mis reflexiones, ahora que acabó de celebrar mi Jubileo de Oro como sacerdote.

Como todos lo hacemos, vivimos nuestra vocación, ya sea para matrimonio, familia o profesiones, en pequeños segmentos de días, horas y eventos. Nunca he sido una persona que ha contado o mantiene un seguimiento de cuántos de estos o aquellos he hecho, aunque personas me han preguntado si recuerdo cuántos funerales, bodas o bautizos he hecho. He sido muy activo y muy implicado en todos los aspectos de la vida parroquial y en la Diócesis de Oakland. He experimentado un sacerdocio realizado, tratando de ser el mejor Ministro que pude haber sido en cualquier ocasión y haber hecho lo mejor que pude para presentar a la Iglesia Católica lo mejor posible.

Hoy es la solemnidad de Pentecostés, y he intentado estar en el Espíritu Santo como Ministro. Sé cómo es. Tengo esta experiencia al preparar mi homilía del domingo. Leer y reflexionar sobre los textos. Estudio para exégeta los pasajes, que es tratar de entender su significado en el momento de su escritura. Luego me siento y espero. Que quiere decir Dios, rezo. He encontrado que hacer algo totalmente diferente con el estudio de las escrituras ayuda. Puedo recoger cosas alrededor de mi apartamento o un arreglo de flores, etc. Cuando vuelvo a sentarme y tomar una pluma, digo "muy bien Espíritu Santo" y entonces el Espíritu Santo escribe.

Hace muchos años cuando era un sacerdote joven, hice burla de una pintura

clásica mostrando uno de los evangelistas escribiendo su evangelio con el Espíritu Santo susurrando en su oído que escribir. Siempre recuerdo esa pintura y pienso en aquellos días agnósticos, sólo ahora para confiar en el Espíritu Santo susurrando en mi oído.

También puedo experimentar esa libertadpiritual mientras celebro la liturgia, la Misa. Yo creo que celebró la Misa lleno del Espíritu. Recuerdo uno de mis profesores dándonos un retiro reflexionando en la espiritualidad de los sacerdotes. En esos días cuando el Latín era usado siempre en la liturgia, el salmo 42 que comienza "Ad Deum qui laetificat juventutem meum." 'Voy a ir al altar de Dios que trae alegría a mi juventud.'

El profesor sacerdote esperaba y oraba para que siempre celebráramos la liturgia con alegría juvenil. Que sería difícil hacerlo en latín, pero en el momento que comencé a celebrar la Misa, ya no era en latín. Sin embargo, me esfuerzo al celebrar la Misa ahora al igual que hace 50 años, con fe, con fervor, con entusiasmo, con alegría.

Creo que la liturgia es una forma de guía, que las frases traducidas del latín, a menudo no son en inglés vernáculo. Son directrices. Mientras que, en años anteriores, hace centenarios, se derivaba de una espiritualidad de siglos de antigüedad y preocupados por la salvación eterna. Hacen muy poca mención de la ayuda que necesitamos en la tierra para vivir y servir bien aquí. Personas a menudo mencionan que les gusta mi enfoque realista y amigable de la celebración de la Eucaristía. Sacerdotes recién ordenados son a menudo muy rígidos o estructurados en su celebración de la Misa, centrándose más en rúbricas como les enseñaron. Toma un tiempo crecer en la celebración de la Eucaristía, para sentir las oraciones, para celebrar en el Espíritu.

Recuerdo que este maestro del seminario que una vez me animó a rezar la liturgia, con gozo y no mecánicamente, era también el mismo profesor de filosofía que dijo que no deberíamos esperar estudiar filosofía hasta que tuviéramos 50 porque no teníamos suficiente experiencia en la vida. Creo que lo mismo puede decirse sobre la espiritualidad.

Una cosa es aprender alguna doctrina, devociones y oraciones. Otra cosa es madurar, vivir, para encontrar a Dios en forma personal, para atraer a la religión, una palabra que significa encontrar el vínculo con Dios.

"Ese día se darán cuenta," dijo Jesús, 'que estoy en mi padre y Él está en mí y estoy en ustedes.' (Juan 14). Es Pentecostés, un Pentecostés personal para cada uno de nosotros. Tal vez, usted lo experimentó una vez hace mucho tiempo. ¡Orar (desear) experimentarlo de nuevo!
