WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time/Domingo Decimoquinto Tiempo Ordinario

We see a especial situation in today's Gospel. Jesus sent out his Apostles, in pairs, to preach repentance. Repentance is a sorrow for sins - recognition that my sins have hurt me, other people and God. Repentance opens up the floodgate's of God's grace. When people listened and repented, the Apostles then could drive out demons and cure illnesses by anointing with oil. (In our glass ambry you see the three oils - one of them is for the anointing of the sick.) When we repent and pray, wonderful things can happen in our families, our parish and our world. This is urgent. To underscore the urgency, Jesus sent the Twelve with no food, no money, no backpack. The time is short. Make a decision now. Tomorrow is too late. Now is the time to repent and pray. We do not know what kind of trials will come, but they will come. Sometimes people ask why we have so many trials and difficulties. Why doesn't God just make things smooth for us? If you think about it, the answer is evident. God allows trials and difficulties for our greater good - to bring us back to Himself. You and I have to make a choice in this life - either for God or to separate from Him. This is fundamental - the basic reason for our existence. When we get the basics right, other things fall into their place. This applies in our lives, our families and our world. If we put God first, if we treat others with dignity, then things start to go well. If we don't, things start to turn sour. Pope Benedict makes that point in his new encyclical "Caritas in Veritate" (Love in Truth). The reason our world economy has gone bad is because we have forgotten the basics. The same is true in our individual lives. You and I may not be able to do much about the global economy, but each one of us has control of our lives: Do I want to put God first or turn away from him? Do I want to treat others with dignity or brush them aside? God allows trials and difficulties to come so that we will turn back to him and treat others properly. That was the message the Virgin Mary gave to the children at Fatima (and other visionaries): Repent and pray. We hear that same message in today's Gospel: Repent and pray.

Vemos una situación especial en el Evangelio de hoy. Jesús envía a los Apóstoles, dos en dos, para predicar arrepentimiento. Arrepentimiento es dolor a causa de pecados - un reconocimiento que mis pecados me han herido a mi mismo, a otras personas y a Dios. Arrepentimiento abre los cielos. Cuando les escuchan y se arrepienten, los Apóstoles podían echar demonios y curar a los enfermos, ungiéndolos con aceite. (En nuestro templo se puede ver los tres aceites en la Sacristía - uno de ellos para la unción de enfermos.) Cuando se arrepienta y reze, cosas maravillosas puedan suceder en nuestras familias, nuestra parroquia y nuestro mundo. Es urgente. Para subrayarlo, Jesús envía a los Doce sin comida, dinero o mochila. El tiempo es breve. Hacer una decisión ahora. Mañana es tarde. Ahora es el momento para arrepentirse y rezar. No sabemos que pruebas vendrán, pero, si, vendrán. Algunos se preguntan porque hay tantas pruebas y dificultades. ¿Por qué Dios no hace la vida más fácil? Si uno lo piensa bien, la respuesta es evidente. Dios permite pruebas y dificultades para nuestro mayor bien - para volver a él. Tú y yo tenemos que tomar una decisión - escoger Dios o separarse de él. Es fundamental - el motivo básico de nuestra existencia. Cuando hacemos bien las cosas básicas, las otras cosas encuentran su lugar. Esto aplica a nuestras vidas, nuestras familias y mundo. Si ponemos a Dios en el primer lugar, si tratamos a los otros con dignidad, las cosas empiezan a ir bien. El Papa Benedicto afirma esto en su nueva encíclica "Caritas in Veritate." (La Caridad en la Verdad). La economía global ha ido mal porque nos hemos olvidado las cosas básicas. Tú y yo no tenemos mucho control sobre la económica mundial, pero podemos cambiar nuestras vidas: ¿Pongo a Dios en primer lugar u otras cosas? ¿Trato a otros con dignidad o los pongo a los márgenes? Dios permite pruebas y dificultades para volver a el y tratar a otros correctamente. Era el mensaje que la Virgen María se les dio a los niños de Fátima (y otros videntes): arrepentirse y orar. Es lo mismo mensaje del Evangelio: arrepentirse y orar.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

At the time of the Reformation, although England broke away from papal authority under Henry VIII, a silent majority clung to the Catholic faith. Henry's eldest daughter, Mary, restored the "old religion" in a fierce persecution of Protestants (she is called "Bloody Mary" for good reason.) His youngest daughter, Elizabeth, rejected papal ties. Under her reign, beginning with legislation in 1593, Catholics were persecuted again, and only the very wealthy could afford the fines for not attending Anglican services on Sunday. They were called "recusants," from a Latin word meaning "refuse," since they refused to attend the liturgy of the Church of England. Many families maintained Catholic tradition in secret, and today their descendants claim "Recusancy" as a mark of family pride. For generations they sent their young people abroad to be educated in convents and monasteries. It is not surprising that the first monastery in colonial America springs from Holland with the daughters of patrician English recusant families. Port Tobacco, Maryland, proved fruitful soil for the Carmelite tradition.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Mañana celebramos la fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Carmen, reconocida en Chile como Maipú. Chile es un país con mucha industria marinera y la Virgen del Carmen es la patrona de los marineros por el peligro al cual se exponen en el mar. Los frailes Carmelitas han difundido la devoción a la Virgen del monte Carmelo desde el siglo XIII. En aquella época María regaló el escapulario al general de los Carmelitas, Simón Stock, prometiendo que todos los que lo usasen serían recibidos por ella en el cielo, evitando así el infierno. Con el tiempo el escapulario Carmelitano se modificó para uso de todo cristiano. Por esto ella es patrona de todo oficio que tiene peligro de muerte como el de los soldados, camioneros, pilotos, troqueros, etc.

Por entender el escapulario como algo mágico, Nuestra Señora del Carmen ha sido tomada como patrona de los pandilleros porque viven en peligro de ser matados en sus riñas callejeras. Piensan que llevar puesto el escapulario es lo necesario para evitar el infierno e ignoran que usar el escapulario es vivir como María, en paz y al servicio de los demás.
