**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL**

**Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time/Domingo Decimosexto Tiempo Ordinario**

The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.” This is the invitation that today’s responsorial psalm is putting before us. To recognize that the lord is the only one who can satisfy all our needs. But before this, first of all, we need to discover which are the needs that I have today. In order to do that, we have to recognize and to think upon the situation in which I am living today. For this, first of all, we have to ask ourselves some simple questions: Who am I? To what am living for? What am I doing here? We can summarize all this questions into one: To which am I living for? This is the fundamental question that every human being should ask themselves, because this question shapes our existence, and sooner or later we should have to face it and give it an answer. The main problem is, that most of the time we do not know what we live for. We do many things as robots and we do not know why. We get up early, we go to work, we eat, we rest, we fall in love, we marry, or remain single, etc. We do all this and we do it without knowing why. Most of the time we do not want to think about this, because that would imply that we can make mistakes, and we do not like to make them. Today the Lord takes his disciples to a place for them to rest, and to share their experiences about their going two by two announcing the kingdom, so He, the Lord, can prepare them, for a very important mission-to be shepherds. To be shepherd today means to know the flock. Christ is looking at the crowd that followed him and saw many people tired and overburdened, like sheep without a shepherd, there is not a guide, they are disoriented. They hear many voices, but they do not know who to obey. Like us, we have many opinions, but nothing convinces us, and much less they take away the doubts that life has put before us. Courage! Christ is giving us today the solution to our doubts in the responsorial psalm: “The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.” So, let us ask him, the good shepherd, to gives us the grace of following him, of listening his voice, and to obey it, so that, when other voices come to us we have the strength to dismiss them. May God bless you always.


“El Señor es mi pastor nada me falta.” Esta es la invitación que hoy nos hace el salmo responsorial, reconocer que el Señor es el único que puede satisfacer todas nuestras necesidades. Pero, necesitamos reconocer cuáles son nuestras necesidades hoy. Para esto, necesitamos pensar y analizar nuestra situación. Primero, ¿Quién soy yo? ¿Para qué vivo hoy? ¿Qué estoy haciendo aquí? Estas simples preguntas, son las que nos hacemos todos los días, y podríamos resumirlas en una sola, ¿Para qué vivo? Esta es la pregunta fundamental de todo ser humano. Esta pregunta condiciona nuestra existencia, y tarde o temprano tendremos que confrontarla y dar una respuesta. El problema es que casi nunca sabemos el por qué de nuestra existencia, hacemos muchas cosas como autómatas y no sabemos por qué. Nos levantamos, trabajamos, comemos, descansamos, nos casamos o nos quedamos solteros, etc. Hacemos todo esto y mucho mas sin saber por qué, no sabemos o no queremos pensar, porque eso sería reconocer que algunas o muchas veces nos hemos precipitado en llegar a conclusiones y tomar una decisión, y a lo mejor equivocarnos, y no nos gusta reconocer nuestros errores. Hoy el Señor, se lleva a sus discípulos a descansar, después de haberlos enviado a predicar de dos en dos, y conocer sus experiencias de esta misión, para poder prepararlos para algo mucho más grande, el ser pastores. Para ser pastor hay que conocer al rebano, sino es un lio tremendo. Cristo mira a la muchedumbre y ve que están como ovejas sin pastor, no hay un guía, están desorientados, escuchan muchas voces y no saben a quién atender. Como nosotros hoy, escuchamos muchas opiniones y pareceres, pero nada nos convence, y muy pocas cosas nos sacan de las dudas que la vida misma nos plantea. Pero ¡Animo! Cristo nos da la solución hoy en el salmo responsorial. “El Señor es mi pastor nada me falta.” Pidámosle a él, al buen pastor, que nos conceda la gracia de seguirlo, de escuchar su voz, y de obedecerla. Y cuando vengan otras voces, la duda, la tentación, etc. Podamos rechazarlas y seguirlo solo a él. Que Dios me los bendiga a todos ustedes y a sus familias.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The American Revolution cleared the way for freedom of religion in the former colonies, since the colonies had always been a more religiously tolerant place than the old country. Even so, colonial laws restricted the practice of the Catholic faith, and just as in England, Americans who desired to be priests or nuns had to go to the Netherlands or France. As political storm clouds gathered in France, an American woman, Mother Bernardina Matthews, the prioress of the Hoogstraeten Carmel in Holland, made a brave move. With two other American nuns, her nieces, and a Dutch sister, she came to Port Tobacco, Maryland, in 1790. Within twenty years the community had grown to twenty, although by 1823 their farm failed and they had to move to Baltimore and open a school. The Carmelite order requires contemplation and cloister, so in time the school was closed. The Port Tobacco land had long since been sold, but in 1976 a community of nuns was able to return thanks to loyal neighbors who had worked for forty years for their restoration. ### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Desde el Concilio Vaticano II la Iglesia, como Pueblo de Dios, ha tomado la imagen de una peregrinación para definir su presencia en este mundo. Para los hispanos la peregrinación más antigua es la de Santiago de Compostela en España cuya fiesta celebramos esta semana.

Según la tradición, Santiago Apóstol evangelizó España y después de su muerte su cadáver fue llevado a Galicia por acontecimientos milagrosos. En el siglo VII señales de estrellas llevaron al descubrimiento del lugar de su entierro y se construyó un santuario con el nombre de Campo de Estrellas. Eventualmente, a finales del primer milenio cristiano, empezaron las famosas peregrinaciones a Santiago.

Después de muchos siglos la mejor manera de llegar a Santiago todavía es a pie. Recorrer el camino de Santiago es caminar sobre las huellas de innumerables peregrinos que durante más de mil años han ido trazando el sendero.
