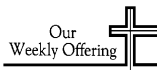

WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL

Twentieth-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time/Domingo Veintiocho Tiempo Ordinario


“Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” This is the question that most of us ask to ourselves very often, what must I do to go to heaven? So, Christ answered to the young rich man: “You shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not bear false witness, you shall not defraud, honor father and mother...” It seems that Christ made a mistake by not saying the first commandment, “ You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your mind, all your strength...” But it is not so, because if we do not kill, or steal, or commit adultery, etc. it is because we prove that we do love God above everything and we fulfill the Law, but it was missing to love God with our whole heart, this whole heart, means to love him with all our feelings, affections, desires. And to love God with all our mind means to love him with all our dreams, wishes, so we will not kill, or defraud, or we will not commit adultery, we will not steal, or bear false witness. And to love God with all our strength means, to love him with everything that we possess, with all our money, this is the most difficult, like the rich young man, he had many possessions, that why he went away sad, he fulfilled partially the Mosaic law, but this part was missing. We need God in order to fulfill the Law. The Good news of the Gospel is at the end of today’s reading, “For man it is impossible but not for God.” What is not impossible for God? To love us more than his only begotten Son, that why he hand his son over to us, to kill him so we can be saved, because we can not love him completely only partially, but Jesus Christ loves his father totally, because he is God, he has the same nature of his father that it is love. So let us ask our Father, God, the grace to accept this free, gratuitous love, so we can have a thankful heart, and the necessary wisdom (as the first reading of today’s liturgy says) to put into practice All the commandments of God’s Law. May God bless you always.

“¿Maestro bueno, que debo de hacer para heredar la vida eterna?” Esta es la pregunta que muchos de nosotros nos hacemos muy a menudo, ¿Qué tengo que hacer para llegar al cielo? Pues Cristo le responde al joven rico: “No matarás, no robarás, no cometerás adulterio, no dirás falso testimonio, ni mentirás...” Parece que aquí Cristo comete una torpeza y no comienza con el primer mandamiento “Amaras al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu mente y con todas tus fuerzas...” Pero no es así, ya que si no robamos, o matamos, o cometemos adulterio, sino mentimos y no defraudamos, estamos dando cumplimiento y probamos que Amamos a Dios sobre todas las cosa, pero falta una para amar a Dios. Amarlo con todo el corazón (es con todos nuestros sentimientos, deseos, afectos), con todo con toda nuestra mente (planes, sueños, deseos) si lo hacemos así, no cometeremos ni adulterio, ni mataremos ni robaremos, ni diremos falso testimonio ni mentiremos, entonces solo falta una cosa, amar a Dios con todas las fuerzas, de ahí que Cristo le invita a vender TODO lo que tiene, y tenia mucho, y dárselo a los pobres. El joven rico, se entristece por que tenia muchas posesiones, era muy fuerte económicamente hablando. Este es el mayor impedimento, por que aunque no tengamos muchos miles de dólares, lo mucho o lo poco que tengamos, somos incapaces de dejarlos por amor a Dios, y mucho menos dárselo a alguien mas necesitado que nosotros, poniendo muchas excusas (muy validas por cierto, guardar para el mañana que nunca se sabe que es lo que traerá, etc.), por que tampoco amamos a nuestro prójimo. Es interesante que nosotros que nos justificamos, como hace el joven rico (“todo eso lo he cumplido desde mi juventud...”),no vemos que al final necesitamos la ayuda de Dios para cumplir la ley. Pero la buena noticia en este Evangelio está al final, “para el hombre es imposible, pero para Dios nada es imposible...” ¿Que no es imposible para Dios? Amarnos mas que ha su propio hijo, por eso lo entregó por nosotros y por nuestra salvación, ya que nosotros no podemos amarlo sobre todas las cosas, pero su único hijo, Jesucristo, si puede por que es Dios. Pidamos le a nuestro Señor que nos conceda la gracia de aceptar este amor gratuito y así poder tener un corazón agradecido y la sabiduría (como nos dice el libro de la sabiduría en la primera lectura hoy necesaria para poner en practica los mandamientos de la ley de Dios. Que Dios me los bendiga siempre.

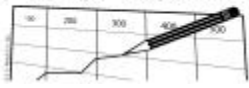

Jesus uses tough language that we may not want to hear. But, we are all called to be generous with all our gifts. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

They say that it is not so much that Columbus discovered America, but rather that after he arrived, the new world "stayed discovered." The sponsorship of Ferdinand and Isabella assured that the news would flash around Europe with an air of authority that other "discoverers" lacked. One of the oft-mentioned early visitors is Saint Brendan the Navigator, a sixth-century Irish monk who had trouble staying at home. He is said to have sailed to "the Isle of the Blessed" in a leather-bound boat, and to have been away from his monastery for seven years. Upon his return, the stories of adventures to a new land attracted pilgrims to his monastery in the Blasket Islands, off the west coast of Ireland. Columbus is said to have referred to The Voyage of Saint Brendan, a very popular adventure in those days. Only after his American journey is Brendan said to have gone to tamer lands to the east, England and Scotland. In 1976, Tim Severin set out on a two-year voyage to America from Ireland in a leather-bound boat, traveling in summer and hopscotching from the Faroes to Iceland to Newfoundland, and encountering along the way exactly what Saint Brendan describes: icebergs, whales, and porpoises. Scholars warn not to dismiss this too quickly: just as the ancient Egyptian monks sought to live in the desert, for the Celtic monks exile in a boat was the Irish equivalent. Five centuries after Brendan, other Irish monks may have visited here as a refuge from Viking terror. Rev. James Field, Copyright (c) J. S. Paluch Co

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Existe en Perú un mural milagroso de la Pasión de Jesucristo. Esta imagen reconocida como el Señor de los Milagros, el Cristo Moreno o el Cristo de Pachacamilla fue pintada por un angoleño en el siglo XVII para una cofradía de africanos. A mitad del siglo un fuerte terremoto sacudió a Lima y las paredes de la cofradía se cayeron, sin que se dañara el mural. Eventualmente la imagen se reveló como milagrosa para los que oraban delante de ella. En la imagen aparece Jesús crucificado. Sobre él está el Espíritu Santo y el Padre. A la derecha de la cruz está su Madre con el corazón traspasado por una lanza y a su derecha, el fiel discípulo amado. Esta imagen es venerada como el Señor de los Milagros. Sin saberlo el artista angoleño ha pintado una reflexión teológica sobre la divinidad y la humanidad de Jesucristo. En su pasión redentora Jesús abre las puertas del cielo y de la comunicación entre el cielo y la tierra, entre Dios y la humanidad representada por la Madre y el discípulo.
