Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

AUGUST 4, 2019

Ecclesiastes 1:2;2:21-23;
Colossians 3:1-5,9-11;
Luke 12:13-21

Wisdom means putting everything in its proper place in relation to our purpose in life. The old Baltimore catechism stated our purpose in a few words: "To know, love, and serve God so as to be happy with him in this life and in the next." We were created for God. True wisdom is to seek God and to serve him with all our heart. If we have any goal contrary to this goal, we shall not be happy and we shall not be wise.

But our full goal of eternal happiness was not known in ancient times. The author of Ecclesiastes knew that no earthly pleasure or possession could satisfy us. He knew that God was the answer, but he still knew nothing of heaven. For this reason he begins and ends his book with a rather despairing cry: "Vanity of vanities, and all is vanity!" You work hard, and for what? You will die and leave your wealth to others.

The man in the Gospel is likewise foolish. He lived only for this world. When he had a tremendous harvest, he decided to build bigger barns and to enjoy himself. Jesus calls him a fool, for he would die that very night.

For what do we work? What is our purpose in life? Do we really live as we say we believe? Do we try each day to love and serve the Lord? Do we live each day as if it is to be our last on earth? If so, we shall have peace. If not, we shall probably be miserable.

Our second reading fits in with this theme: Set your hearts on higher things. You have been baptized into Christ. You live his life. You have died to sin, so don't return to it. Put to death anything which would keep you away from God. You are a new person, a new creation in Christ: Live as one!

THE CAJUN FACTOR

I, L'Anne Sciba, have been reading "The Beginning of the End of Abortion" by Shawn D. Carney who started **40 Days For Life**. The book is full of stories about men and women who lead 40 Days for Life campaigns or who support them. This book inspired me as I realized again how important those people are who pray outside of Hope Medical Group in Shreveport. One chapter in the book was titled, **"The Cajun Factor"** and it was about two of Louisiana's pro-life leaders. They are both young men with families. **Chris Davis** and **Ben Clapper** know abortion isn't going to just go away. They have fortitude; they work to end abortion and educate people across Louisiana. Shawn tells the story of Chris Davis from Shreveport deciding to take a break from leading another 40 Days for Life campaign. He was tired. However, Chris changed his mind and as always he persuaded, cajoled and just kept asking people to come out and pray at the Bossier City abortion facility. That was in 2017 and that was the last time there was a 40 Days for Life campaign in Bossier City. **WHY?** That year Bossier City Medical Suite abortion facility closed its doors forever after performing over ten thousand abortions! The second person in the "Cajun Factor" chapter was Ben Clapper, President of Louisiana Right to Life. He has recently established a Northwest Louisiana chapter of Louisiana Right to Life in Shreveport/Bossier. Because the Shreveport abortion center does the most abortions in the state, Ben is dedicated to helping pastors, Christians and churches understand the important role we play in bringing abortion to an end in Shreveport. He's hosting the 2nd Annual Pro-Life Prayer Breakfast in Shreveport in August just for that reason. God uses people to make change - be one of those who say, "Yes, I'm going to do something to end abortion in Shreveport." The Pro-Life Breakfast can be that first step for you!
