# Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time AUGUST 11, 2019

Wisdom 18:6-9; Hebrews 11:1-2,8-19; Luke 12:32-48

None of us is going to get out of this alive! To prove the point, do you know of anyone who is 150 years old? They have all gone. Some time in the future, each one of us will be called to give an account of our lives before God, the just Judge who cannot be deceived. Today's readings tell us to live in faith and expectation, to be ready for God's summons, for we don't know when it will come.

The first reading is from Wisdom. The reading describes the expectation of the Israelites in Egypt for their deliverance. They kept hoping and waiting. But Wisdom was actually written a thousand years after the Exodus. It was written to encourage many Jews who were again living in Egypt.

Unfortunately, these Jews in Egypt were prospering greatly; they were attracted to the pagan culture of Hellenism. The author of Wisdom urges them to look back to the faith of their forefathers.

The second reading tells us that faith is the realization of what we hope for, the evidence of what we believe. The reading gives us examples of people who lived by their convictions.

The Gospel is an unlikely story to teach a truth. It is very unlikely that any master would ever wait on his servants! But the parable says this! If we are loyal to Christ, and if we keep wide awake in our faith, he will surely be our Savior, our Paraclete, our Mediator. He will share his heavenly banquet with us.

### THE CAJUN FACTOR

I, L'Anne Sciba, have been reading "The Beginning of the End of Abortion by Shawn D. Carney who started 40 Days For Life. The book is full of stories about men and women who lead 40 Days for Life campaigns or who support This book inspired me as I realized again how important those people are who pray outside of Hope Medical Group in Shreveport. One chapter in the book was titled, "The Cajun Factor" and it was about two of Louisiana's pro-life leaders. They are both young men with families. Chris Davis and Ben Clapper know abortion isn't going to just go away. They have fortitude; they work to end abortion and educate people across Louisiana. Shawn tells the story of Chris Davis from Shreveport deciding to take a break from leading another 40 Days for Life campaign. He was tired. However, Chris changed his mind and as always he persuaded, cajoled and just kept asking people to come out and pray at the Bossier City abortion facility. That was in 2017 and that was the last time there was a 40 Days for Life campaign in Bossier City. WHY? That vear Bossier City Medical Suite abortion facility closed its doors forever after performing over ten thousand abortions! The second person in the "Cajun Factor" chapter was Ben Clapper, President of Louisiana Right to Life. He has recently established a Northwest Louisiana chapter of Louisiana Right to Life in Shreveport/Bossier. Because the Shreveport abortion center does the most abortions in the state, Ben is dedicated to helping pastors, Christians and churches understand the important role we play in bringing abortion to an end in Shreveport. He's hosting the 2nd Annual Pro-Life Prayer Breakfast in Shreveport in August just for that reason. God uses people to make change - be one of those who say, "Yes, I'm going to do something to end abortion in Shreveport." The Pro-Life Breakfast can be that first step for you!
