Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

We have all experienced certain "turning points" in our lives. Without these "turning points" or transitions, growth is not possible. Every transition means some kind of dying or letting go of the familiar and comfortable to venture into the unknown. It means stretching our "comfort zone" to reach out to the unfamiliar and the uncomfortable. Once we get used to it, we gain greater freedom and growth takes place.

Today's gospel, on this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, shows us a "turning point" in the life of Jesus – leaving Nazareth to begin his public ministry. The arrest of John the Baptist was the signal for this new path in the life of Jesus. It was time to leave His mother, His trade as a carpenter, His residence in Nazareth, to begin His mission of preaching the good news and healing the sick and possessed. Jesus' commitment to doing the will of the Father led him to begin His mission without any question.

Similarly, all the various events of our lives can be seen as a call to greater growth which, at times, is painful. We are usually not eager to give up our security, the familiar and the comfortable to venture out to the unknown. This much is certain. However, if we respond to the call of Jesus, we will sacrifice certain pleasures, but we will receive what will be best for us in return. He told His disciples: "Whoever follows me will receive a hundred times more and will be given eternal life."

What is Jesus asking of you? I really don't know the answer with certainty as you are the only one who can answer that question in your prayers. I know, however, that for some, it may mean getting to know Jesus better through the Gospels and the Sacraments. For others, it may mean getting involved in the activities of the parish. And, still for others, it may mean ministering more generously to the needy, or taking better care of employees, or working more honestly and diligently. At the very least, we can become the witnesses of His love, to be the light that shines in the darkness of the world. Once we open ourselves to Him, respond to His call and surrender ourselves to Him, He can do wonders with us.
