"And why are we doing this exactly?" I'm on my knees in front of her, half smiling, looking up into her face, my thumb smoothing the tape line of this exposed heart. I asked the question, even though we'd just talked it over that morning at breakfast, about how we need to give love to others. So of course, she's trying to put into practice her mother's half-baked words and I'm going to have to tell her this is bold and brilliant, making herself into a walking sign of my little breakfast lecture.

Usually I'm the one cupping her face in my hands, but now she's got me here, kneeling in front of her, so she takes my face into her hands. And she bends so close I can feel her breath warm.

"We need to tape hearts right to us, Mama. So we always know." She strokes my cheek. "So we always know his love's around us everywhere."
