Do you think Jesus really cared who the crowds thought he was? Most of the pervading wisdom is that great people do not care what others think about them, or who they are. As long as they are true to God and themselves, that is what truly matters to them. Was this question then just a set-

up question to get the disciples thinking so he could ask them, what his closer friends and disciples thought? I suggest that maybe he really did care who they thought he was. Generally it is also true that people who love others care deeply what the ones they love think. Jesus' love was deeper than the love of any man who walked this earth. He came to save all people so he probably did care what the crowds thought, but this caring did affect what he knew he needed to do. He told them bluntly even though they did not want to hear it, "The Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed ... I would bet that is all they could hear. At that point they probably could not hear, "and on the third day be raised." Jesus, because of his love, could not compromise what he was called to do. And he would not let his disciples compromise either, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me." He sounds like a good coach warning the players that if they are going to be on this team there is a lot expected of them and there can be no compromise to get the job done. Yes Jesus cared deeply he cared too much to let us followers try to do an end run around the cross.
