"What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind", Jesus asked the crowds. No he says rather you went out to see a prophet and a great prophet, "Amen, I say to you, among those born of woman there has been none greater than John the Baptist." That is high praise

coming from the Messiah, the Anointed One. It is interesting to go back to the first chapter of Luke's gospel (his gospel alone has these great stories of the beginning) how John the Baptist was conceived in Elizabeth and how Jesus was conceived in Mary. Zachariah the husband of Elizabeth was serving as priest in the temple of Lord when an angel appeared to him. The Angel Gabriel told Zechariah that he was blessed because his wife, beyond childbearing years, would conceive and give birth to a son. Zechariah had questions, just as Mary had questions when she was told that she would conceive without the help of a man. The conception of John would be the normal way in that Zechariah and Elizabeth would come together, but what was not normal was how old she was. Zechariah must have had the wrong attitude because Gabriel the Archangel took offense and struck him mute until this miracle would come about. Finally when Elizabeth did have the baby named John, Zechariah's tongue was loosened and he broke out into what we call "Zechariah's Canticle." To this day we pray this canticle every morning all year long in the official prayer of the church called the "Liturgy of the Hours." Zechariah says about the prophet, his son, John, "And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, to give knowledge of salvation to his people in the forgiveness of their sins..." (RSV Luke 1:76-77). This was a prophecy from his infancy and now much later as both Jesus and John are doing their ministry. Jesus' words about John the Baptist confirm what God had been doing and preparing behind the scenes. Hopefully we will listen to John and repent to prepare the way. Jesus even gave us a Sacrament called Reconciliation, Penance or Confession so that in our time we will prepare the way of the Lord into our hearts by repentance from our sins. Hopefully you will celebrate that Sacrament this Advent. We have a number of priests coming Sunday at 4 pm to give us that opportunity.
