In this Gospel "Thomas said to (Jesus), 'Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?' Jesus said to him, 'I am the way and the truth and the life.'" The Disciples did not know where Jesus was going and what was ahead of them. Jesus affirms that (He) is "the way." He was not abandoning them, but would walk with them (and us as well) through the

power of the Spirit. In John's gospel, Jesus, on the very night of the resurrection, appears to the disciples and breaths on the them the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel of John it is very clear that when Jesus was lifted up on the cross, it was the beginning of a victory movement when the Holy Spirit would be poured upon the earth and continue to show us the Way. We hear Jesus say, "It is finished"; and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit" (John 19:30). Earlier in the Gospel he had said, "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself. He said this to show by what death he was to die" (John 12:32-33). Through the working of the Holy Spirit, Jesus' on-going Divine presence in the world, he would draw everyone to himself. If we would allow ourselves to be drawn, Jesus would be "the way and the truth and the life" walking with us and within us in the power of the Holy Spirit. When we receive Holy Communion, we receive God within, Father, Son and Spirit to keep us on the right way. When we stay with the Way, the Truth, and the Life, we can also walk with confidence and we can light the way for others. On this Mother's Day weekend, I am thinking of the power a mother has to show her children the Way in the home. On the cross Jesus gave his mother to the Beloved Disciple (John 19:27); that would be me and you, beloved one! The US Bishops have referred to the home as the Domestic Church where parents introduce their children to Jesus, the Way. In the blessing of fathers and mothers after baptism we pray, "God is the giver of all life, human and divine. May he bless the father of this child. He and his wife will be the first teachers of their child in the ways of the faith. May they be also the best of teachers, bearing witness to the faith by what they say and do, in Christ Jesus our Lord." On this Mother's Day, may God bless our mothers for giving us the best and ever giving Gift, Jesus who will always be with us as the Way, and the Truth, and the Life."
