Today we celebrate Epiphany that remembers Jesus was a light to the nations even as a child. He was never meant to be just for the Jewish people even though he fulfilled their longed for messiah. The magi from the east symbolize all of us gentiles or non-Jews. All were meant to worship the Son of God who came to bring light, peace and hope to the world. The ruler of the time, the powerful one, Herod, did not want to lose

his control so under the guise of worship wants the magi to find the baby so he could destroy him. We don't hear that part today but as the story continues and he is foiled by God's intervention with a message to the magi, he destroys all the babies in the region below the age of two. God intervenes in an amazing way with another message to Joseph in a dream to save hope. This story juxtaposes the light of God and the darkness of the world. To this day the light shines on in the darkness. I will be going to Haiti this Thursday. In Haiti we have the poorest country in the western hemisphere right off the coast of the richest country. History tells us why it is so. The unbelievable evil of slavery and control plays a huge role. Yet we are trying to give a hand up to them by building a school. This last Thursday, January 4, we celebrated Elizabeth Ann Seton and how she converted to Catholicism and was a huge part of founding the Catholic school system in the USA. She was a light in the darkness. A few years ago I dedicated this school building to her. After Haiti I will go to Mexico to visit the migrants that come up here and to practice my Spanish since I am the Coordinator of Hispanic ministry in the Diocese of Fargo. Mexico has it's own darkness as you know. Please pray for me and all of those going for safety and protection. May God help us to be like Jesus: lights rather than contribute to putting out the light of Christ!
