I was looking down on him as the Lord looks down on us. Then I heard Mary's words a little later in my Evening Prayer. "He has Lifted up the lowly and filled the hungry with good things." Of course, Mary also adds: "He has cast out the mighty from their thrones and sent the rich away empty." I do not want to be cast down from my high place so I will come down by my own accord. The words of the song came to me. "It's a gift to be simple. It's a gift to be free. It's a gift to come down where we ought to be." I'm doing well and hope all at St. John's are as well. I will pray for you and hope you will pray for me.
