Stewardship Moment - *"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" John 6:9*

The miracle of the Loaves and Fishes is the only miracle which is recorded six times in the Gospel. It carries two important messages. First, no matter how little we have, we always have enough to share. Second, Christ can take our humble gifts and do great things with them if we are just willing to let Him. No gift is too small or insignificant!

This week we begin the Bread of Life Discourse in John chapter six. John the Evangelist is our patron. He does not have the words of institution like Matthew, Mark and Luke have: "Take and eat this is my body..." But John's chapter six is one of the strongest teachings on the reality of the Eucharist in all the New Testament. Jesus expresses the truth of this teaching so strongly that some will walk away from Jesus, "After this, many of his disciples drew back and no longer went about with him." (Jn 6:66) In the beginning of this chapter, though, Jesus is really popular, John mentions, "A large crowd followed him because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick" (6:2). Then we hear of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and it reaches a fever pitch. Jesus, therefore flees to the mountain to be alone because they want to make him king (Jn 6:15). People like it, leaders provide for them. There are different aspects of this gospel that are hidden at first glance. One point about this gospel that fills out the story is that the boy offered five barley loaves and two fish. Barley loaves would be the offering of a poor person because it is a lesser quality bread. Fr. Len Loegering, now deceased going on three years this fall, used to talk about the boy's offering. Even though he was from the poor, he offered what he had and he provided for many. Sometimes we think we do not have much to offer, but if it is put into the hands of Jesus great things can happen. In fact, twelve full baskets were leftover. Twelve is always the number of fullness in the scriptures: twelve tribes of Israel corresponds to twelve apostles for the nations. God provides for his people abundantly when we give to Jesus what we have.
