This week's front page is being written on eve of Election Day. By the time you read this, the outcome of the 2018 Election will be well known and the course of our treasured American democracy will continue into the future. On Monday of this coming week, we celebrate Veteran's Day—the day we honor those who have served so valiantly to defend the democracy that, I pray, you participated in this past Tuesday, November 6.

We certainly value the freedom and liberty enshrined in our American way of life, especially the very real way that democracy is expressed—with your vote. Regardless of whom you voted for, voting itself is democracy in action. The demos (or "people") of ancient Greece valued their ability to rule (*arche*) as a collective expression of the will of the people. Modern democracies also value the independence of the electorate to choose the individuals they feel are best suited to rule the collective society. Voting rights are enshrined in no less than three of the Amendments to U.S. Constitution: #15, #19 and #26. The Bill of Rights (the first ten Amendments to the Constitution ratified by the States in 1791) were orchestrated by James Madison, then a member of the House of Representatives, to counter any Federalist claim that no bill of rights was needed because the people and the states kept any powers not given to the federal government. Madison originally proposed 17 rights, 12 of which were ratified by Congress and finally 10 ratified by the States.

Interestingly enough, do you know how the First Amendment begins? (When we cover religion in America, I have to correct the undergraduates on this topic every time.) Everyone thinks it begins with the Freedom of Speech, but this is really the second part of the First Amendment. Enshrined in the very first words of the First Amendment of the Bill of Rights is what has commonly been known as "Freedom of Religion." Actually called the "disestablishment clause," the First Amendment reads: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof..." (then it goes on to talk about the Freedom of Speech).

The very founding of this country was religiously motivated. Pilgrim leader John Winthrop landed in America in 1630, in what is now Boston, to set up a free society where people could worship God openly and freely. He imaged the fledgling colony in light of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, specifically Matthew 5:14, as a "city upon a hill. The eyes of all people are upon us, so that if we shall deal falsely with our God in this work we have undertaken, and so cause Him to withdraw His present help from us, we shall be made a story and a byword through the world." This "city set on a hill" has been safeguarded by the Constitution and the Bill of Rights, as well by the countless men and women who have served in defense of our nation for over 200 years. Did you know that 6.5% of the total US population have served in the military? There are 21 million veterans currently in the United States: 16.1 million living veterans served in at least one major war and 5.2 million living veterans have served during peacetime. 81 Representatives and 16 Senators in the current Congress are veterans. The American military not only actively defends our country at home and abroad, but engages in countless peacekeeping and humanitarian relief efforts throughout the world. As a people who value our right to express our Catholic faith, we have to thank our current service men and women as well as countless veterans (many of you who are reading this today)—Thank You!

And of course, may the living God bless our land, its newly elected leaders and every one in the United States of America.

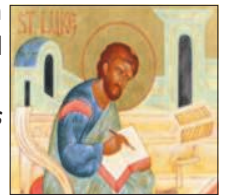
