PALM SUNDAY**THE STORY OF OUR REDEMPTION**

We begin the final week of Lent with these familiar readings. This year, we hear the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. These readings for Palm Sunday and the Passion used to be read on successive Sundays. Now they are combined into a single feast, so that we may see the whole sweep of the glory and the suffering played out. Jesus accepts the adulation of the crowd, the foreshadowing of his glory in the Resurrection. He bids farewell to his disciples in his last Passover, and forgives his tormentors as he dies on the cross. Later this week, we enter the Holy Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when the whole story of our redemption will play out once again.

PALM SUNDAY RECONCILIATION

We invite you to join us on the evening of prayer, examination of conscience and the sacrament of reconciliation at St. Jerome on Palm Sunday, April 14, at 6 p.m. There will be several priests to hear confessions and help us in preparation for Easter. Don't forget that every adult Catholic is obligated to go to confession at least once a year.

HOLY THURSDAY

Holy Thursday is a day of the institution of the Eucharist and priesthood. Mass of the Lord's last Supper will start at 7 p.m. After the Mass we will stay for adoration and private prayer.

GOOD FRIDAY

Good Friday is a day of prayer, fast and abstinence. Every person 14 years of age or older is to abstain from meat and those who are between the age of 18 and 60 are to fast on that day. Join us for the Liturgy of Lord's Passion at St. Jerome at 3 p.m. and for the Procession with the cross at 6 p.m.

The special collection on Good Friday will be for the care of the churches and shrines in the Holy Land.

HOLY SATURDAY - EASTER VIGIL

Holy Saturday is a day without liturgy. We join Christ who was in a tomb waiting for joy of Easter resurrection. At 7 p.m. we will start with Easter Vigil - a celebration of light, resurrection and joy.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION CELEBRATION

Our young parishioners will celebrate their First Holy Communion on Sunday, May 5, at the 10 a.m. Mass. Please, keep all of them in your prayers. We hope that receiving Jesus in the Sacraments may never become routine, for them or for us.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

This weekend, many churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a lulav, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the lulav, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the Hoshanot, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches today, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, what do you think would be the best choice to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion
